GOLF MANITOBA 2019 STANDARD LOCAL RULES and TERMS OF THE COMPETITION

- Effective January 2019 -

Play is governed by the 2019 Golf Canada Rules of Golf, and where applicable, by the following Local Rules and Terms of Competition, subject to changes, additions or deletions for particular Championships by the Golf Manitoba Rules of Golf Committee. The player's attention is drawn to Terms of the Competition on the Golf Manitoba website.

Unless otherwise noted, penalty for breach of a Local Rule or Condition is the general penalty: Match play - Loss of hole; Stroke play - Two strokes

1. **Out of Bounds (Rule 18.2)** - Defined by course-side points at ground level of white dots or stakes and fence posts. A ball is out of bounds when it is beyond any wall defining the boundary of the course.

2. Clubs and Balls

- a. List of Conforming Driver Heads: Model Local Rule G 1 is in effect. Penalty for making a stroke with a club in breach of the Local Rule: **Disqualification**.
- b. List of Conforming Golf Balls: Model Local Rule G 3 is in effect. Penalty for breach of the Local Rule: **Disqualification**.

Note: An updated List of Conforming Clubs and Balls is available via golfcanada.ca/rules.

Caddies - In stroke play competition where a caddie is permitted, a player is prohibited from having another
person who has played that day on the competition course from serving as their caddie during their stipulated
round (see Note to Rule 10 - 3a).

The player gets the **General Penalty** for each hole during which there is a breach of this Local Rule. If the breach occurs between the play of two holes, it applies to the next hole.

- 4. **Pace of Play (Rule 5.6)** See the competition's Notice to Competitors for the 2019 Golf Manitoba Pace of Play Policy. Note that Rule 5.6 (unreasonable delay) is still applicable.
- 5. **Suspension of Play (Rule 5.7)** The course and all practice areas are closed when play is suspended for a dangerous situation until the Tournament Rules Committee has declared them open. A player practicing in these areas when closed will be subject to penalties under the Code of Conduct.

Note: A suspension for a dangerous situation will be signaled by one prolonged air horn note. All other types of suspension will be signaled by three consecutive air horn notes. Resumption of play will be signaled by two short air horn notes.

- 6. **Practice** Note to Rule 5.2 & 5.5 is in effect. Prior to and after their round in stroke play, a player may practice in the designated practice areas. A player must not practice on or near the putting green of the hole last played or roll a ball on the putting green of the hole last played. Penalty for first breach: **General Penalty** (applied to the player's first hole). Penalty for second breach: **Disqualification**.
- 7. **Motorized Transportation** is permitted in all events except the Junior Bantam, Junior Interclub and the Junior Championship.

Players or their caddies are not permitted to travel with their motorized cart beyond the point on the course where their ball lies to gauge yardage or to seek the position of the hole.

A player who will play, or has played, under penalty of stroke and distance is always authorized to ride on motorized transportation for that purpose.

Please refer to the complete Motorized Transportation Policy via golfmb.ca/policies.

The player gets the **General Penalty** for each hole during which there is a breach of this Local Rule.

8. Abnormal Course Conditions (Including Immovable Obstructions) (Rule 16) -

Ground Under Repair - Rule 16.1 includes:

- a. Areas defined by white lines
- b. French drains filled with stones and/or sand
- c. Seams of Cut Turf If a player's ball lies in or touches a seam of cut turf or a seam interferes with the player's area of intended swing:
 - (i) Ball in the General Area: The player may take relief under Rule 16.1b.
 - (ii) Ball on Putting Green: The player may take relief under Rule 16.1d.

But interference does not exist if the seam only interferes with the player's stance. All seams within the area of cut turf are treated as the same seam in taking relief. That means that if a player has interference from any seam after dropping the ball, the player must proceed as required under Rule 14.3c (2) even when the ball is still within one club-length of the reference point.

- d. Immovable Objects White lined areas of ground under repair and the artificially surfaced road or path or other identified obstruction they tie into are treated as a single abnormal course condition when taking relief under Rule 16.1.
- 9. Wood Chips and Mulch Wood chips and mulch are loose impediments.
- 10. Integral Objects The following are integral objects from which free relief is not allowed:
 - a. Wrappings, wires, cables and other similar objects when closely attached to trees
 - b. Artificial walls and/or pilings which are adjacent to the edge of bunkers
 - c. Bunker liners in their intended position. Interference by a liner with a player's stance is deemed not to be, of itself, interference under this Rule.
- 11. **Permanent Elevated Power Lines or Cables** If a ball strikes a permanent elevated power line or cable, the stroke does not count. The player must play a ball without penalty from where the previous stroke was made (Rule 14.6).
- 12. **Temporary Immovable Obstructions** Model Local Rule F 23 is in effect. Temporary Immovable Obstructions include, but are not limited to, starting tents, scoring tents and pace of play stations.
- 13. **Penalty Areas (Rule 17)** When a red penalty area is defined on only one side, it is deemed to extend to infinity. When a red penalty area adjoins a boundary, the penalty area edge extends to and coincides with the boundary.
- 14. **Restricting the Use of Audio and Video Devices** Rule 4.3a(4) is modified in this way. During a round, a player must not listen to or watch content of any nature on a personal audio or video device.
- 15. Code of Conduct (Rule 1.2) Golf Manitoba has adopted the Local Rule under Rule 1.2b setting standards of player conduct on the golf course during play at all amateur competitions. The full policy is available online at golfmb.ca.

The Golf Manitoba Tournament Committee may assess any or all of the following penalties outlined in the structure below, based on the severity and frequency of the violation:

- Warning
- One penalty stroke
- General Penalty
- Disqualification

Note: Under <u>Rule 1.2a</u>, a Committee may **disqualify** a player for serious misconduct for acting contrary to the spirit of the game.

16. **Close of Competition** - The competition is deemed to have closed when the trophy has been presented to the winner or, in the absence of a prize ceremony, when all scores have been approved by the Committee.
