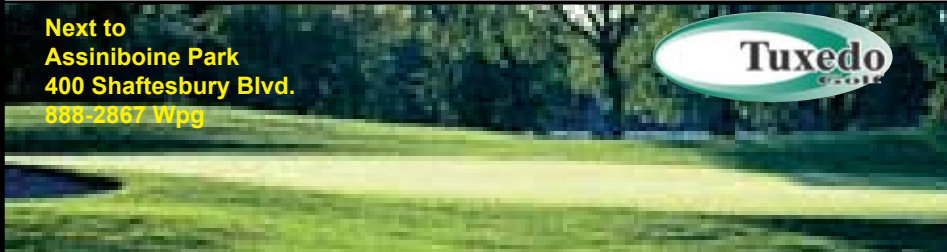

**From the

IT'S THE 32ND EDITION of this annual publication for the golfers of Manitoba and it has been my pleasure to be involved with most of them over the years. That's going all the way back to 1980 when the **Manitoba Golf Association** first offered the *Manitoba Golf Annual*. There have been some changes along the way to reach the current stage of the *Golf Manitoba Journal 2011* presented by **Golf Manitoba**, the governing body of the sport in Manitoba and Northwest Ontario since the amalgamation with the **Manitoba Ladies Golf Association** in 2003. My, the years do really fly by, don't they?

THE START OF THE 2011 SEASON has been a little later than usual, but most of the courses reported the heavy covering of snow during the winter has been a good thing and fairways and greens seemed to be generally in very good shape as the season finally got going very later in April or in early May. Golfers can only hope there is no repeat of the wet seasons experienced in recent years.

IT SHOULD BE ANOTHER EXCITING season for local golf fans with the national men's amateur championship to be played at Niakwa and Elmhurst in August and the continuing growth of the Players Cup event on the Canadian Tour at Pine Ridge in July. It would be nice to see some fan support at the provincial championship events, too!

THERE MAY BE SOME CHANGES COMING on the municipal golf scene as it appears the Winnipeg City Council is going to take a deep look into the money-losing operations. We should expect to see some further management arrangements and the possible sale of some of the courses before long. Kildonan Park, Windsor Park and Crescent Drive are the only courses still fully operated by the city, but courses like Assiniboine, Canoe Club, Rossmere, St. Boniface and Wildewood are also city-owned and leased to the clubs. The question is whether the clubs could be in a position to purchase the land or whether the city could continue to own the land and make suitable lease arrangements. Stay tuned — it could get very interesting.

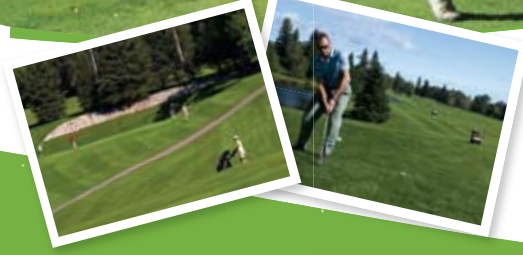

Executive Director Report

Amateur golf in Manitoba and North West Ontario has a long and storied history. The Manitoba Golf Association (MGA) was established in 1915 and the Manitoba Ladies' Golf Association in 1922. In 2003, the two associations amalgamated to create the current Golf Manitoba. Combining the resources of the two associations has allowed us to more effectively deliver the programs and services we offer. In the fall of 2010, another historical event occurred with the launch of the new Golf Manitoba brand. This change was made as a result of a nationwide move to create clarity as to who is responsible for administering amateur golf. Golf Canada (formerly the Royal Canadian Golf Association or RCGA) launched the new brand in the spring of last year for the following reasons:

- Golf Canada is better understood and more relevant within the sporting community. Many National Sport Organization's use the same concept (Canada Basketball, Hockey Canada, Rugby Canada, Skate Canada, etc.).
- Golf Canada is a bilingual name, consistent in both official languages.
- Golf Canada does not have an acronym and therefore will help limit confusion.

Along with the above mentioned reasons for the change, the provincial golf associations were provided the opportunity of using similar consumer facing brands which will allow for a better alignment between Golf Canada, the national governing body, and the ten provincial bodies. As a result, Golf Manitoba is very pleased and excited to launch our new look. The new brand represents the Manitoba black and gold as worn by many provincial teams and the maple leaf will replace the former logo displaying alignment with the national governing body. To date, 8 of the provincial golf associations have adopted a version of this brand.

The evolution of golf's involvement in Games (Canada Games in 2009 & Western Canada Games for the first time this year) has allowed Golf Manitoba to train our top young athletes on a long term basis. Previously we did not have the ability to work as closely and for as long with our top players (teams were decided based on an event as opposed to training and qualifying from a number of competitive experiences). As a result of this, Golf Manitoba has shifted our focus in Player Development to longer term training. In order to do so, some changes that have been made for 2011 are:

- Players qualifying for our provincial teams will now be provided with a \$500 subsidy to assist with costs associated with participating in national championships as opposed to Golf Canada and Golf Manitoba covering the complete cost. The teams are now three person teams as opposed to the previous four players.
- The Manitoba / Minnesota Matches will no longer take place.

Golf will once again be a participating sport in the Manitoba Games in 2012. Our goal is to hire coaches in the eight regions of the provinces who are members of the PGA of Manitoba to conduct training programs similar to what we are doing provincially. The vision is that these training programs will grow the game at the club and regional level and that those players wishing to participate competitively will now have a progression from Manitoba Games to Western Canada Games to Canada Games and maybe even Pan-Am Games or the Olympics. It truly is an exciting time for golf development in our province!

Golf Manitoba continues to evaluate our programming very closely and we are always trying to ensure what we are doing is relevant to golf in Manitoba and North West Ontario. In the Championships division, we will have the following changes:

- Power carts will now be permitted in all our events except for junior events.
- Entry fees have been increased by \$10 but those players registering on-line will pay a reduced fee equivalent to the 2010 fee.
- The Rural Junior Championship will now be contested in conjunction with the Rural Amateur / Senior Championship.

Historically I have tried to bring attention to major golf championships being held in Manitoba and North West Ontario and this year we are once again fortunate to have world class golf coming to Manitoba. The Niakwa Country Club and the Elmhurst Golf & Country Club will be hosting the Canadian Men's Amateur Championship. This is Canada's premier amateur men's championship which will see a number of the world's top amateurs compete. Also, Pine Ridge Golf Club will again play host to the Canadian Tour's Players Cup. This event is the premier stop on the Tour and well worth seeing. Pine Ridge, Niakwa and Elmhurst will do a wonderful job hosting these world class events and I would encourage you to get out and see the high caliber play and support the tournaments.

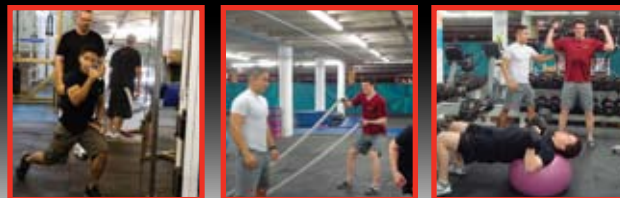

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Junior Girls Nassau Team

The Nassau League continues to be a tremendous training opportunity for Golf Manitoba's junior girls team. The team enjoys the opportunity to learn and compete against Manitoba's top amateurs and play different golf courses, many that they haven't played before. After a very successful inaugural season in 2009 the team moved up to compete in the "A" Division in 2010.

Following an excellent fourth-place finish, the team bowed out in the first round of the playoffs to the eventual champions from Southwood. Many thanks to **Brenda Prystayko** from the Pine Ridge Golf Club who was the non-playing captain for the Junior Girls Team and who dedicates many hours to the program.

Junior Boys Mundie Putter Team

Similar to the Nassau League, the Mundie Putter League is an excellent training opportunity for Golf Manitoba's Junior Boys Team. The team narrowly missed out of a playoff spot in a very competitive "A" Division finishing in sixth place. I would also like to thank **Dennis Prystayko**, who was the non-playing captain for the Junior Boys team and who gives of his time to assist.

Western Canada Games

For the first time, golf will be one of 19 sports participating in the 2011 Western Canada Games in Kamloops, British Columbia.

Based on 2010 competitive results, 11 boys and 11 girls were selected to be part of Golf Manitoba's Western Canada Games training squad.

In December, the squad began training to prepare for the upcoming golf season and the Games. The winter program consisted of weekly team practices at The Golf Dome followed by a team work out at XCEL Fitness. Certified trainers **Kate McKenzie** and **Dan Russell** oversaw the fitness program. Golf Dome memberships were also included for team members. Thank you to **Curtis Gray** of The Golf Dome for his continued support in this regard.

The spring/summer season will include sport science opportunities with **Melanie Gregg** from the University of Winnipeg, a parent/player seminar, rules education, weekly team practices and participation on Golf Manitoba's Mundie Putter and Nassau teams. The training squads will compete in eight qualifying rounds with players using their top six scores. This scoring system will determine the top four girls and the top four boys who will become Team Manitoba for the Games in August. □

CN Future Links Program

2010 was Golf Manitoba's most successful CN Future Links season to date. Almost 4,000 young golfers took part in clinics and Golf Manitoba's Player Development Intern, **Mackenzie Prasek**, oversaw and conducted most of these clinics.

The National Golf in Schools Program also saw a major increase in participation. This program is designed for elementary aged children with a focus on grades 2 to 6. Oversized plastic clubs with soft tennis ball sized golf balls ensure a fun and safe environment that is easy for school teachers to administer. The popular program has seen over 50 schools in Manitoba purchase their own Golf in Schools kit. The excitement of this well received program is a great sign for the growth of junior golf in Manitoba.

Golf Manitoba is also involved with three other Future Links programs. They are the City of Winnipeg camps, the Mini U camps and the Rural Clinics. CPGA Professional **Glen Sirkis** is the lead instructor for Golf Manitoba in both the City of Winnipeg and Mini U programs. The week-long camps feature instruction in the morning with on-course golf in the afternoon. The programs are an excellent approach to get young golfers involved with the game.

University of Manitoba Golf Team

The University of Manitoba Bison Golf Team continues to succeed on a number of levels. Both the Men's and Women's

teams competed in the Canadian University Championship at the Kingswood Park Golf Club in Fredericton, New Brunswick. The Women's Team finished in sixth place out of 10 teams while Men's Team finished eighth out of 20 teams. Both teams were ranked ninth in Canada by the Post Secondary Golf Coaches of Canada. 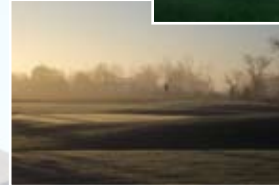

9 Scholarships Awarded

The Board of Directors of the Manitoba Golf Scholarship Fund Inc. has announced the awarding of the nine scholarships to outstanding individuals, who have participated in the Manitoba golf community, demonstrated academic excellence and are pursuing their post-secondary studies at Canadian educational institutions.

Lucas Wazney of the Elmhurst Golf and Country Club is the winner of the \$1,500 *Dr. Daya Gupta Award for Outstanding Scholastic Achievement* for obtaining the highest academic standing of all of this year's applicants. Lucas is enrolled in the faculty of Civil Engineering at the University of Manitoba with plans of graduating in 2013. He had a top-30 finish in the 2009 Manitoba men's amateur championship.

The following eight individuals will receive \$1,000 scholarships, which are supported in 2010 by the Manitoba Golf Scholarship Fund (\$7,000) and Manitoba Blue Cross (\$1,000):

Bryce Barr of the Southwood Golf and Country Club has entered his first year of studies at the University of Manitoba. Following a year of University 1, Bryce intends on pursuing a degree in biochemistry. He was the runner up in the 2009 provincial junior championship and represented Manitoba at the national junior men's championship.

Matt Dodds from the Carman Golf Club is attending the University of Calgary and plans on obtaining a Bachelor of Commerce and eventually become a chartered accountant. Matt finished tied for 11th in the 2009 Manitoba junior championship.

Scott Markham from the Niakwa Country Club is in his final year of Law School at the University of Manitoba after completing a four-year degree at the Asper School of Business where he received the Gold Medal in his last year for achieving the highest academic standing among all graduating students. Scott finished tied for third at the 2009 Manitoba men's amateur championship and represented Manitoba at the national men's amateur as a member of the Willingdon Cup Team. He was also medalist at the 2009 Manitoba match play championship qualifier and the 2009 Niakwa club champion.

Scott Mazur of the Transcona Golf Club has entered his first year of studies at the University of Manitoba and is planning on pursuing an accounting degree through the Asper School of

Business. Scott finished tied for seventh in the 2009 Manitoba men's amateur championship and was the 2009 Transcona club champion, the youngest winner in the history of the Club.

Joey Ringaert of the Niakwa Country Club is working towards completing his degree in the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Manitoba with an expected graduation of June 2013. Joey finished tied for 35th at the 2009 Manitoba men's amateur championship.

Jesse Skelton is pursuing his degree in Actuarial Mathematics at the Asper School of Business at the University of Manitoba and will be graduating in April of 2011. Some of the highlights of Jesse's 2009 competitive golf season included a 17th-place finish at the Manitoba men's amateur championship, tied for 32nd at the National university/college championship and a number of top ten finishes at University of Manitoba events.

Bri-ann Tokariwski of the Elmhurst Golf and Country Club has entered her first year of studies at the University of Manitoba with aspirations of obtaining a Bachelor of Recreation Management. She was a member of Team Manitoba at the 2009 Canada Summer Games and finished fourth at the 2009 Provincial junior women's championship.

Matt Tower of the Glendale Golf and Country Club has entered his first year of studies at the University of Manitoba and hopes to pursue a degree in biology or engineering. He finished tied for 35th in the 2009 Manitoba men's amateur championship and 32nd in the 2009 provincial junior championship.

The Manitoba Golf Scholarship Fund (MGSF) is a registered charity with the goal of providing financial assistance to young golfers pursuing post secondary education at institutions in Canada. The annual scholarships are granted based on the interest earned from the fund as well as contributions from partners such Manitoba Blue Cross. The capital fund grows annually from donations made by individuals, donations made in honor of someone and golf clubs within Manitoba and Northwest Ontario making contributions. Tax receipts are given for donations to the Fund. Golf Manitoba supports the Fund administratively which allows for very little administrative overhead. The Fund began in 1986 and has awarded 139 scholarships for a total of \$134,500. □

Aaron Cockerill named Manitoba Golfer of the Year

Provincial junior champion **Aaron Cockerill** of the Teulon Golf and Country Club was selected as the 2010 Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year when the award was presented at the Golf Manitoba annual awards dinner Oct. 18 at Breezy Bend Country Club.

Cockerill was a first-time nominee for the honour. The other finalists in the 2010 voting were **Garth Collings** and **Peter More**, both from Breezy Bend.

Cockerill won the Golf Canada Western Future Links championship, the provincial junior men's championship and was sixth at the Golf Canada Prairie Future Links event. He was the medalist

in the match play qualifier, won a Maple Leaf junior tour event, low individual at the provincial junior interclub resulting in the Teulon team winning the rural division, was runner up at the rural junior championship and capped off the season with a 10th place finish at the national junior men's championship. He is currently ranked 40th on the Golf Canada national amateur order of merit and ninth in the country in the junior order of merit.

Collings, a five-time winner of the award and now a 16-time nominee, won the Manitoba mid-amateur for the sixth time, won the mid-masters category (40-and-over), was runner up in the Manitoba amateur championship and was a member of two provincial teams (Willingdon Cup and mid-amateur). He finished tied for 13th at the Canadian mid-amateur and fourth at the national mid-masters. He was also runner up at the Grey Owl championship and a member of the Breezy Bend Team that finished runner up at the Provincial Interclub Championship. Collings is currently ranked 66th on the Golf Canada national order of merit.

More, Manitoba's Golfer of the Year in 2001, is the 2010 provincial men's amateur champion as well as the provincial match play champion. He won the Elmhurst Invitational and finished tied for 38th at the national men's amateur championship. Peter is currently ranked 32nd in the Golf Canada national order of merit.

Four players earned honourable mentions for their strong 2010 campaigns: **Mike Berney** of Transcona, **Jenna Roadley** of Glendale, **Myles Sullivan** of Portage and **Bri-ann Tokariwski** of Elmhurst.

Berney was the provincial men's senior champion and a member of the provincial senior team. He finished tied for 33rd at the national men's senior and was the low individual at the provincial senior inter-club.

Sullivan was the runner-up at the provincial men's junior championship, a finalist in the men's match play, fourth at the rural junior, finished 34th at the national junior and qualified for the United States junior championship.

Tokariwski was runner-up at the provincial women's junior and third at the women's

amateur resulting in her being on two provincial teams. She was also a runner-up at a Maple Leaf Junior Tour event.

Roadley was the provincial junior women's champion, runner-up at the Golf Canada Prairie Future Links championship, represented Manitoba at the national junior women's championship as well as a member of the CJGA team on the North American Cup.

The Amateur Golfer of the Year Award dates back to 1975 and was presented for the 36th time. □

Brian Gilhuly receives Distinguished Service Award

Brian Gilhuly, a long-time member of the Selkirk Golf and Country Club, has been chosen as the fourth recipient of the Golf Manitoba Distinguished Service Award.

The prestigious award was presented at the Golf Manitoba annual awards dinner Oct. 18 at Breezy Bend Country Club. It was initiated in 2007 and the first winner was **Jerry Budyk** of Elmhurst Golf and Country Club. **Don Forsyth** of Bel Acres Golf and Country Club was the winner in 2008 and the award for 2009 went to **Betty Grant** of the Windsor Park Ladies Golf Club.

Brian Gilhuly has been a volunteer since 1986 with the Manitoba Golf Association and Golf Manitoba. His initial start as a volunteer came as a club representative for the Selkirk club and as a starter and scorer in tournaments.

He joined the Manitoba Golf Association Board of Governors in 1989 and has continued on the board since the amalgamation with the Manitoba Ladies Golf Association in 2004. He was the finance chair from 1990 to 2005.

Gilhuly became a course rater in 1991 when the present course rating and slope system was adopted and he became the chair of the handicap and course rating committee in 2001, following the retirement of **Gord Lenton**, a role he continues to play. Through the 2010 season, he had completed 177 course ratings.

He has volunteered as a walking scorer at St. Charles Country Club for the LPGA tournament in 1992, the PGA Championship Tour event in 2000 and was a hole marshal for the 2010 CN Canadian Women's Open championship.

When he isn't volunteering for Golf Manitoba, Gilhuly devotes countless hours to the Selkirk Golf and Country Club, where he

has served on various committees since 1958. He was a board member at Selkirk from 1960 to 1974 and again from 1986 to the present. He is also the current treasurer of the club, where he has been since 1988. The Selkirk club recognized his long-standing commitment in 2004 by honouring him as a life member.

Gilhuly spends countless hours travelling to measure courses prior to actually conducting a course rating. He also spends a lot of time in front of his computer working on ratings as well as trips into the Golf Manitoba office to process the ratings. His devotion to amateur golf is extremely evident in his passion for course rating as well as his dedication to the board and the association.

"Brian's long-term dedication to the game of golf exemplifies what it means to be a Golf Manitoba volunteer," said Golf Manitoba president **Harvey Goehring** as he made the presentation. "His passion and professionalism of course rating is a true asset to our association. His diligence in all he does is indeed outstanding and we are pleased to recognize him with the Distinguished Service Award."

Along with the Distinguished Service Award, Golf Manitoba also recognized all volunteers within the association for their years of service to the association. Recognition was given to those individuals reaching the five, 10, 15, 20 and 25-plus years of service.

Gilhuly was recognized in the category for 25 years-plus, while 15-year awards went to **Lorne How** and **Michelle Lee**, a 10-year award to **Florence Mehmel**, and five-year awards to **Richard Berube**, **Aija Culley**, **Gord Hudson** and **Graham Robson**. □

The list of members in the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame was increased to 40 when four new inductees were introduced at the eighth annual induction ceremonies Sept. 22 at the McPhillips Street Casino.

Three athletes and one builder made up the 2010 crop of inductees, bringing the total members to 26 athletes, 12 builders and two in the athlete/builder category.

The 2010 athlete inductees were **Terry Hashimoto**, **Rob McMillan** and **Aileen Robertson**, who were joined by **R.J. (Bob) Picken** in the builder category.

It was the eighth year for the awards ceremony to be presented by the Casinos of Winnipeg division of the Manitoba Lotteries Corporation, with the inaugural event held at the Club Regent Casino in 2003 and seven at the McPhillips Station Casino.

Don MacDonald, president of the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame and Museum, and past-president **Joyce Collier** were in charge of the presentations, with **Clayton Dreger** of Radio Southern Manitoba as master of ceremonies.

The deadline for submitting nominations for the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame is April 30 each year, with the selections announced in the summer. Information is available through the organization's website at www.manitobagolfhalloffame.com or through the Golf Manitoba office.

TERRY HASHIMOTO

Born in Winnipeg March 14, 1958, Terry Glen Hashimoto established a remarkable record on the Manitoba golf scene. He was named Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year three times and was a finalist five more times through a 22-year span from 1976 to 1998.



He represented Manitoba in team play 10 times -- as a junior in 1976, eight times on the amateur Willingdon Cup teams (1977, '79, '80, '81, '83, '85, '96 and '98) and on one Mid-Amateur team in 1998. He was a member of Manitoba's winning Willingdon Cup team in 1996. He won the Manitoba Amateur championship twice (1985-1998), the provincial match play championship three times (1983, 1985, 1998), the mid-amateur championship in 1998 and was low amateur in the Manitoba Open championship twice (1979, 1980).

Hash, as he was known, was a triple champion in Manitoba in the 1998 season, winning the provincial amateur, mid-amateur and match play titles. His Golfer of the Year honours came in 1976, 1980 and 1998, and he was a finalist for that title in 1978-79-81-83-85. He was also a nominee for Manitoba Athlete of the Year in 1998 in recognition of his triple title accomplishment.

He attended University of Miami on a scholarship and won seven college tournaments during his career. He was low amateur in the Pan-Am Open tournament and served as a team captain of both the junior and senior teams at Miami. At age 17, he placed seventh in the Junior Orange Bowl tournament in 1975.

He became a professional golfer in 1986 and served for a year as club pro at Bel Acres. He played on the Canadian Tour from 1986 to 1988, finishing seventh in the

CPGA championship in 1986 and getting to 17th on the Order of Merit in 1988. It took five years to regain his amateur status in 1993.

Hashimoto was also known for golf activities off the course, particularly the development of Jazz Golf, the first and only club manufacturing operation in Manitoba. He opened the first Caddy Shed golf store in 1981. He opened the Champions Nest driving range and practice facility in 2003.

ROB McMILLAN

He was born December 8, 1975, at Thunder Bay, ON, but Rob McMillan's outstanding golf achievements are strictly a Manitoba production.

The golf record books are filled with the McMillan name. The lists show him as a four-time Manitoba Junior champion, three-time Manitoba Amateur champion, one-time Manitoba Open champion, two-time Canadian Juvenile champion, three-time Canadian Junior champion, one-time Canadian Amateur champion, one-time world Junior champion, twice member of Manitoba's winning Willingdon Cup teams, six-time winner of Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year awards and two-time selection as Manitoba Male Athlete of the Year.

Robo, as he is known, made history early as the first ever to win the Canadian Juvenile and Junior championships in the same year. His three Canadian Junior titles tied for the most ever won. He won the 1996 Manitoba Open as an amateur, competing against the professionals on the Canadian Tour, then added the Canadian Amateur title in the same season.



McMillan was provincial junior champion for four straight years, 1991 through 1994, also adding the provincial amateur title in '93. He followed up with two more Manitoba Amateur crowns in '95 and '96. He played on four provincial junior teams, winning national honours in 1991. He played

on two Manitoba Willingdon Cup teams in 1995-96, winning the national competition both years. He also represented Canada twice at the World Amateur championships.

He was chosen Golfer of the Year in 1990, was a finalist in 1991 and won the honour again in 1992-93-94-95-96.

Attending University of New Mexico, McMillan was a two-time All-American selection, three-time All-conference selection, Western Athletic Conference Freshman of the Year in 1995 and placed sixth at the NCAA Division 1 national championship in 1996.

McMillan played nine years of tour professional golf, seven on the Canadian Tour and two on the Nationwide Tour. Adding to his 1996 Manitoba Open victory as an amateur, he also won twice as a pro on the Canadian Tour -- 2000 Vancouver Open and 2002 Barefoot Classic. He was fourth on the all-time career money list for the Canadian Tour and was a board member for three years.

He played in 10 PGA events (seven Canadian Opens and three Air Canada championships). He is the currently executive chairman of the Canadian Tours Players Cup event.

R.J. (BOB) PICKEN

For more than 60 years, Robert John Picken has kept Manitobans well informed on events in the world of sports through broadcasting and writing and he has been recognized for his achievements in many areas.

His induction into the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame is a tribute to his detailed attention to golf events in the province. He is similarly honoured by his inductions in recent years to the Canadian Curling Hall of Fame, Manitoba Curling Hall of Fame, Manitoba Baseball Hall of Fame, Winnipeg Football Club Media Hall of Fame, Canadian Football Media Hall of Fame and the Manitoba Sportswriters and Sportscasters Roll of Honour.

Born in Winnipeg September 24, 1932, Picken attended St. John's High School and his journalistic career began in 1948 while in high school when he joined the staff of the Winnipeg Citizen to cover a variety of sports, including golf. The paper folded in 1950.

From 1965 to 1969, he was on the sports staff at CJOB and he later returned to that radio station on a free-lance basis from 1993 to 2008, covering mainly golf and curling. He was the voice of sport on CBC

radio commencing in 1969 until his retirement in 1990.

During his career, Picken covered virtually every type of golf event, from provincial and national amateur championships through the Canadian Open, Canadian Senior Open, the duMaurier Classic, the Americas Cup, the World Amateur in Vancouver and two trips to the Masters at Augusta.



In addition to his extensive radio reporting, he also contributed articles in Backspin magazine from 1993 to 1998 and to the Golf Manitoba Journal since 1993.

He has been an active contributor to the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame, being involved as it was being formed and serving on the selection committee from 2003 to 2007. He was master of ceremonies for the first two induction ceremonies. He has also served as chair of the selection committee for the Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year award since its inception in 1975.

Picken has been a director of the Grey Owl golf tournament since 1979, serving as secretary for many years, a two-year term as president and currently is the drawmaster for the event, which marked its 50th year in June.

AILEEN ROBERTSON

Born in Winnipeg June 9, 1969, Aileen June Robertson was an outstanding figure in Manitoba women's amateur golf circles in the decade from 1986 to 1996.

During that time, Robertson was winner of two Manitoba Junior Women's championships, three City and District titles, six Manitoba Amateur Women's championships and crowned it all with a Canadian Women's Amateur championship.

Playing out of St. Charles Country Club, she was the provincial junior champ in

1986 and 1987 and claimed the amateur honours in 1989-90-91-94-95-96. The national championship was won in 1994, when she was also declared Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year along with Rob McMillan, who won the men's national title in the same year. Robertson was also a finalist for the golfer of the year honours twice, in 1989 and 1991 and was a nominee for Manitoba Female Athlete of the Year twice, 1992 and 1994. She also won the Ontario Women's Amateur title and was named Score Magazine's female amateur of the year in 1994.

Robertson represented the province on Manitoba golf teams for 11 straight years, as a junior in 1984-87 and on nine consecutive amateur teams from 1988 through 1996.

She represented Canada seven times at international events including the World Amateur, British Amateur, Australian Amateur, New Zealand Amateur, Mexican Amateur and Commonwealth Championship.

In 1996 at the Women's International Four-Ball tournament in Florida, Robertson was teamed with Marlene Streit and they set a course record 64 and made it to the semi-finals.

While obtaining her bachelor of psychology at University of South Carolina, Robertson was named to the National Dean's Honour List 1988-91 and was named National Golf Coaches Association All-American in 1990-91.



Robertson turned professional in April, 1997, and she won the Guess Challenge event in Quebec, tied for first place in a duMaurier series event in New Brunswick and finished sixth overall in the duMaurier series in that year. She also had two top-five finishes in the series in 1998.

She is now serving as a golf coach for Henry Brunton Golf at Markham, ON. □

Jo-Ann Lindsay inducted Into Sports Hall of Fame

Jo-Ann Lindsay said she was overwhelmed as she was inducted into the Manitoba Sports Hall of Fame on November 6 at the Victoria Inn.

"I always felt the Sports Hall of Fame was for the famous pro athletes and to be included in this group is really awesome," she said.

She earned her nomination into the Hall by winning golf titles over a span of more than 50 years and she becomes the 14th golfer to be recognized. There were eight male and five female Manitoba golfers inducted previously.

She was Jo-Ann Percy when she won her first Manitoba junior women's championship at the age of 14 in 1955. She won the junior honours again in 1957 and played on Manitoba junior teams in national competition in 1955-56-57 as well as the BC junior team in 1959.

After seven years away from competitive golf, she returned as Jo-Ann Snyder to win her first Manitoba women's amateur championship in 1965, the retired from competition again until 1974.

As Jo-Ann Lindsay she won two more provincial amateur championships in 1997 and 2000 and also claimed the City and District title five times from 1978 to 2000.

Her greatest achievements came in the senior division, highlighted by victory in the Canadian senior women's championship in 1991. She tied for second in that event in 1992 and 2000 and was in the top five three times in that period.

She won the Manitoba senior women's championship nine times from 1992 to 2005 and was runner-up in 2001. In addition to her junior teams, she played for Manitoba on seven amateur teams from 1974 through 2001 and was on four consecutive

Manitoba senior teams in 1996 through 1999.

Lindsay was named Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year in 2000 and was also a finalist in 1995 and 1997. She was a finalist in voting for Manitoba Female Athlete of the Year twice, in 1998 and 2000. She was inducted into the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame in 2005.

Internationally, Lindsay won the Minnesota senior match play championship four times, 1991 to 2004, won the Minnesota mixed division championship in 1992 and the Minnesota senior championship in 1994. She won the Minnesota senior four-ball championship in nine consecutive years, 1996-2004 and was a Minneapolis Tournament of Champions winner in 2003. She qualified for the U.S. mid-amateur championship eight times and for the U.S. senior championship 10 times. She was also chosen Minnesota senior women player of the year in 1995 and 2000.

Manitoba female golfers inducted into the Manitoba Sports Hall of Fame before Lindsay were **Marj Edey** in 1984, **Ann Tachan** in 1994, **Merlene Netterfield** in 1997, **Marg Homenuik** in 1998 and **June Bagley** in 2000.

Peter More **only** **double** **winner** **in 2010**

Playing out of the Breezy Bend Country Club, **Peter More** emerged as the only double winner in the Golf Manitoba Parade of Champions for the 2010 season.

More opened the season by winning the provincial men's match play title in June, then followed up with a victory in the Manitoba men's amateur championship in July. He also earned a berth on the provincial Willingdon Cup team and was chosen as one of the finalists in voting for the 2010 Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year honours.

While the medalist honours for the 36-hole match-play qualifying at Minnewasta Golf and Country Club went to Teulon's **Aaron Cockerill** with rounds of 73 and 77 for a 150 total, More shared the runner-up spot with his 77-76—153, matched by **Derek East** of St. Charles with 72-81—153.

As the match play moved into the quarter-finals at Elmhurst Golf and Country Club, More advanced with a 4-and-3 win over **Scott Markham** of Niakwa, while **Matt Gray** of St. Charles got by **Brett Boschman** of Wheat City 2-and-1, **Kody Fawcett** of Selkirk defeated **Teale Merkeley** of Southwood by the same score and Myles Sullivan of Portage was a 2-up winner of **Adrian Kibsey** of Southwood.

More defeated Gray, and Sullivan won over Fawcett by identical 2-and-1 scores in the semi-final matches, then More claimed the title with a 2-up victory over Sullivan in the final.

It marked the third time the match play honours had been won by More, who also claimed the title in 2001, playing out of Rossmere, and in 2006, playing out of Elmhurst.

In the Nott Autocorp men's amateur championship, More was a leader from start to finish as he finished eight strokes in front over the 72-hole test at Breezy Bend. More had rounds of 70-67-71-71 for a 279 total and a runaway victory.

Two fellow Breezy Bend members – **Garth Collings** and **Jesse Skelton** -- shared the runner-up honours with 287. Collings had rounds of 72-74-72-69, while Skelton shot 74-68-71-74. Finishing fourth to claim the final berth on the provincial Willingdon Cup team was **Scott Markham** of Niakwa with 71-72-74-71—288, just a stroke better than **Riley Unger** of Southwood, with 71-73-71-74—289.

At the national men's amateur championship in August at London, ON, the Manitoba Willingdon Cup team finished in a tie for eighth place with 459, well behind the top 425 posted by British Columbia in the team competition.

More was best of the Manitobans with 76-70—146. Collings scored 80-74—154 and Skelton and Markham had identical scores of 81-78—159.

The 2011 Nott Autocorp Manitoba men's amateur championship is scheduled for July 18-21 at the Neepawa Golf and Country Club and the national amateur championship and Willingdon Cup team matches will be played Aug. 9 to 14 at the Niakwa and Elmhurst courses in Winnipeg. □

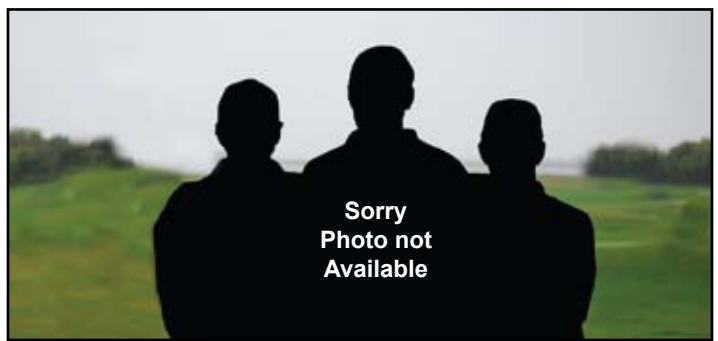

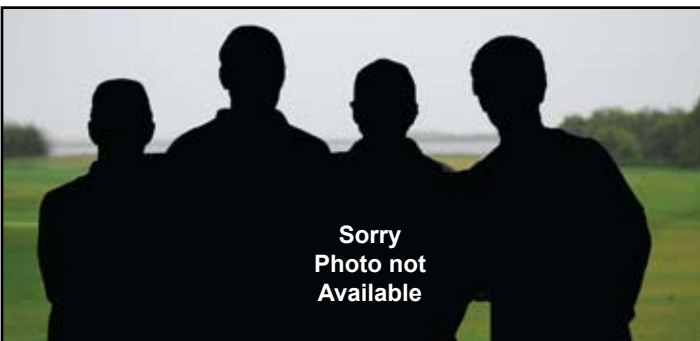

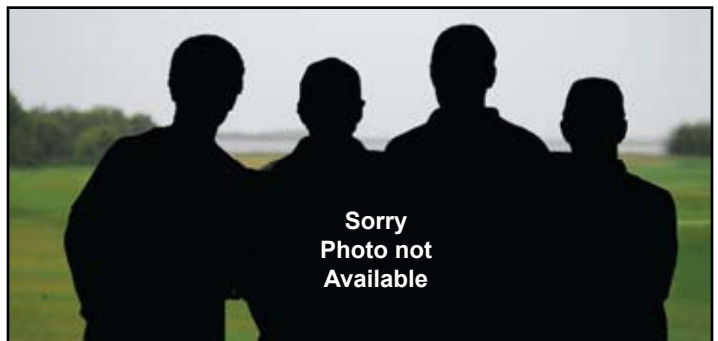

Golf Scene

The long-awaited opening of the new Southwood Golf and Country Club championship layout in St. Norbert will definitely be the highlight of the What's New department for the 2011 season.

In other developments, Manitoba golfers were pleased to learn in the late spring that the Hecla Golf Course will be in operation this season, despite the financial woes of the Hecla Oasis Resort, and work is continuing on a new golf layout at the Lake Manitoba Narrows.

SOUTHWOOD GOLF & COUNTRY CLUB

The Southwood membership is anxiously looking forward to their first chance to play the new course, designed by renowned golf course architect **Thomas McBroom**, in July and also getting in their final rounds at the old course in Fort Garry before that big event.

The new Southwood clubhouse was opened in February and the old clubhouse is no longer in use. The pro shop will continue to operate at the old club until the move to the new course takes place, scheduled for early July.

There will be no lockers or shower facilities available at the old club and members are being encouraged to play their games at the Fort Garry layout, then go the new clubhouse for change of clothing and food and beverages.

Southwood's new general manager is **Miles Mortensen**, who comes to Winnipeg after serving at the Tobiano club at Kamloops, BC, another McBroom course. His background also included roles at Banff Springs, AB, and Whistler, BC.

The new clubhouse features more than 18,000 square feet on two levels with dining, banquet and meeting areas to accommodate up

to 180 guests featured on the main floor, along with a bar, dining areas and administration offices. Locker rooms and shower facilities are located in the basement area.

The pro shop next to the clubhouse will feature storage areas for members' golf clubs and a fleet of golf carts along with a fully-stocked shop under **Tom Kinsman**, who is into his 21st year as the club's head pro. He was also an assistant at Southwood for six years before spending four years in BC.

The new Southwood course, adjacent to the Trappist Monastery Ruins in St. Norbert, will be tended by course superintendent **Ray Savard** and his staff, who have been involved with the development of the new layout as well as keeping the old course in play.

With five sets of tees on each hole, the new course can be stretched out to 7311 yards from the back black tees or can play as short as 5214 yards from the forward yellow tees. There are also blue tees at 6778, white tees at 6411 and green tees at 5960.

Par for the new layout is 36-36—72, with each nine having two par fives, two par threes and five par fours. The longest

par five is the seventh hole at 576 yards from the back. The shortest par three is the 17th at 166 yards from the back.

The Southwood golfers will also find a big improvement in practice facilities at the new course. Sitting on more than 15 acres west of the clubhouse, the practice area will provide a range with teeing areas at both ends and a 350-yard hitting area. There will also be an 8,000-square-foot chipping green for pitches up 80 yards, a 10,000-square-foot putting green and a practice bunker green.

While only the final three holes are along the LaSalle River, there are water or sand hazards, sometimes both, to challenge the golfer on almost every hole. Rolling terrain on fairways and greens will intimidate the players and Kinsman believes the wind will also play a big factor on the new course.

The new address for Southwood Golf and Country Club is 80 Ruines du Monastere in St. Norbert, which runs off Rue des Trappistes. That street runs west from Pembina Highway just north of the LaSalle River bridge.

HECLA GOLF COURSE

When news reports told of the Hecla Oasis Resort being closed and placed into receivership, Manitoba golfers began to wonder what would become of the golf course at that location amid rumors it would not be in operation in 2011. They were pleased to learn in April that the course will be open for play this year under Lakeland Golf Management Inc.

Lakeland president **Harry Brotchie** reported an agreement was reached to operate the 18-hole course on behalf of the receiver. The Lakeland operation also manages four other golf courses in Manitoba — Tuxedo and Harbour View in Winnipeg, Links at the Lake at Gimil and Grand Pines near Grand and Victoria Beaches.

With the resort closed, there will be no major meal service available, but Brotchie said a snack bar will be available at the pro shop.

Al Scott, director of golf course operations for Lakeland, will oversee operations at Hecla along with similar duties at the other four courses, where existing head pros remain on the job for the 2011 season. Course Superintendent **Lloyd Davies** and his staff remain in charge of maintenance at the course.

NORTHWIND NARROWS GOLF & COUNTRY CLUB

Construction of the Northwind Narrows Golf and Country Club is an ongoing project of Narrows West Lodge, located at the west side of the Narrows Bridge on Lake Manitoba.

Golf course architect **David Grant** of Grant Golf is in charge of the land clearing and earth work which has been slowed by wet weather in the past two seasons. There is hope to have the 18-hole lakeside layout nearing completion by the end of this season.

Narrows West Lodge president **Chad Olafson** said the operation is looking forward to adding golf to its site, which is already popular for fishing and other recreational activities. In addition to the lodge, plans call for cottage lots, a hotel and condo developments at the site.

Grant is also involved in another course project in the Russell area, north of the Assissippi ski area, where plans call for a full 18-hole course to be developed. The area has an 18-hole par-three layout which has been in operation for the past two seasons.

The firm has also been active with several alterations on other golf courses in the Winnipeg area and consulting on proposals for new layouts.

There were no reports of any other major changes on the Manitoba scene as the 2011 season opened. □

Niakwa, Elmhurst host courses for National Championship

Fifteen years have gone by since the men's Canadian amateur golf championship has been played in Winnipeg and the long wait will come to end in August when Golf Canada brings the 2011 event to Niakwa Country Club and Elmhurst Golf and Country Club.

This marks the second year the national event has been featured at two locations for the first two rounds of play, a move that started last season when the field was increased to 240 players from 188.

Niakwa Country Club is the host club for the 2011 event, which is scheduled August 9 to 14. A qualifying round is scheduled Aug. 8 at Niakwa, first two rounds of the championship will be played at Niakwa and Elmhurst on Aug. 11 and 12, with a cut before the final two rounds at Niakwa on Aug. 13 and 14.

Bob LaFreniere is chairman of the Niakwa committee in charge of arrangements with a group of 10 committee chairman and a host of volunteers from both clubs working on the event.

The last time the Canadian Amateur was played in Winnipeg was in 1996, when Glendale Golf and Country Club was the site and Manitoba won the second of back-to-back victories in the Willingdon Cup team competition.

Niakwa was originally scheduled to host the event in 2008, but the date was pushed back because of work on the course.

There won't be a long wait for the next Manitoba trip as the 2014 Canadian Amateur is scheduled to be played at Elmhurst as part of that club's 100th anniversary year. □

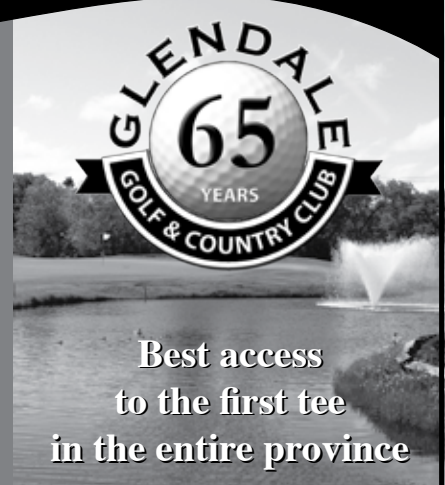

Interprovincial Events Will Feature Three-Member Teams

A decrease in the number of players on provincial amateur golf teams is a major change taking place this year. Starting this season, each province will send three-member teams to all seven national events, down from the four-member teams of the past.

Golf Canada, in partnership with Canada's 10 provincial golf associations, announced a number of changes related to Golf Canada's seven national amateur golf championships beginning in 2011. The changes will impact the competitive format of both the individual and interprovincial competitions.

Interprovincial trophies will be awarded based on the scores of three (3) players with each province counting the best two (2) scores each day over the first two days of the competition.

Players representing their province for the interprovincial competition will not specifically be paired with players representing other provinces on the first two days of the competition.

Opening ceremonies and player banquets which had traditionally included only provincial team representatives will now include all of the players in the competition.

Golf Canada will continue to provide travel subsidies for provincial representatives of up to \$120,000 in 2011, and \$100,000 in 2012, with no travel subsidy in 2013 and beyond. Each Provincial Golf Association will decide to what degree they are able to subsidize the travel costs of players representing their province at each respective national championship.

The existing field selection process (including the provincial quota system) for all national amateur championships will remain the same.

Golf Canada currently spends close to \$1.3 million annually to conduct national amateur championships across the country. Golf Canada will continue to invest in all of the championships with the goal to make them world class competitive experiences for Canadian and international competitors.

"The decision to change the structure of the championships is rooted in our continued commitment to conducting world class national amateur championships," said **Scott Simmons**, Executive Director and CEO, Golf Canada. "We believe that instituting some format changes will strengthen our events as championships of excellence with a greater focus on individual competition, but we are also committed to ensuring that interprovincial competition will continue to be an important component of each event."

Golf Manitoba's mission, as the governing body of golf in Manitoba and North West Ontario is to develop, promote, govern and service the game of golf for the benefit of all participants.

The Manitoba Golf Association was formed in 1915 with five clubs: St. Charles, Pine Ridge, Norwood, Winnipeg Hunt Club and Elmhurst. In 1922, the Manitoba Ladies' Golf Association was formed. Effective April 1, 2003, the Manitoba Golf Association and the Manitoba Ladies' Golf Association amalgamated to form Golf Manitoba.



Recognized by Sport Manitoba as the Provincial Sport Organization (PSO) for golf in the province, Golf Manitoba is responsible for promoting participation in and a passion for the game of golf in Manitoba and North West Ontario. Golf Manitoba is also involved in national golf affairs through its affiliation with Golf Canada.

Golf Manitoba conducts championships, programs and services to help shape the present and future of golf in Manitoba and North West Ontario. Assisting in the delivery of the National Golf in Schools & Future Links Programs, training our young athletes for the Manitoba Games, Western Canada Games and Canada Games and supporting the University of Manitoba Bison golf program are some example of player development in our province. Golf Manitoba also administers the Rules of Golf and handicapping and course rating.

Recognized by Sport Canada as the National Sports Organization (NSO) for golf in this country, Golf Canada is responsible for promoting participation in and a passion for the game of golf in Canada.

Golf Canada actively conducts championships, programs and services to help shape the present and future of golf in Canada. High performance athlete development, National Golf in Schools, Golf Fore the Cure, the Canadian Golf Hall of Fame and Museum and CN Future Links, Canada's national junior golf program, are only some of the initiatives the association leads for golf in Canada. As the authority for golf in Canada, the association also administers the Rules of Golf, amateur status and handicapping and course rating under the respected RCGA brand.

In addition, Golf Canada conducts Canada's most prestigious golf championships. The RBC Canadian Open and CN Canadian Women's Open attract the best professional golfers in the world, while regional junior and national amateur championships provide world class competitive opportunities for Canada's top golfers to showcase their talents. □



Changes in 2011

Manitoba's competitive golfers will notice a few changes as the 2011 golf season gets under way.

Golfers in all provincial championship events except in the junior divisions will be permitted to use power carts this year. The use of carts was previously restricted to play in the senior events. Now, all amateur, mid-amateur and senior competitors, male and female, will be allowed to ride.

"We experimented with the use of carts at the mid-amateur championship last year at Granite Hills and it was a success, so we are extending it to all but juniors this year," executive director Dave Comaskey explained. "We felt some players who find the power carts necessary were unable to enter so this will allow them to do so."

He emphasized this is only for provincial events and those going into national competition will not be allowed to use the power carts.

Golfers will also notice a slight increase in tournament entry fees this season, but there will be a reduced fee which is equivalent to the 2010 fees for those who register for tournaments on line. About 72 per cent of entries in last year's tournaments were submitted on line and it is expected more will take that route this year.

Those who register on line will save \$10 for every tournament they enter through golfmanitoba.mb.ca with a credit card, your ID and Password. Credit and debit payments will now be accepted in the office (previously, only cash and cheques were accepted).

The Nott Autocorp Men's Amateur Championship will be played at the Neepawa Golf and Country Club, a first for Golf Manitoba. It was also announced that the annual Manitoba/Minnesota junior golf matches were deleted from the calendar this season. The

event had been held for about 30 years, alternating locations in Manitoba and Minnesota.

Those competing for berths on the provincial teams who will represent Manitoba at the seven national competitions will have only three positions to fill, down from the four-member teams featured in previous years. This was a decision from Golf Canada (see details in article on the facing page).

There will also be a change in the funding for the teams heading for national events and golfers will have to bear more of the cost. Where full team expenses used to be covered, the team players will now receive a subsidy and will have to make up any additional expenses on their own.

"It brings golf into line with most other amateur sports," said Comaskey. "Many who represent Manitoba at national events have to pay their own way or possibly take part in fund-raising programs."

Another change for the 2011 season will see the rural junior men's tournament played in conjunction with the rural amateur and senior championships, which will allow for some to compete in both junior and amateur divisions at the same time. Seniors will compete only in that division because shorter tees are used in the senior division. The 2011 rural championships will be played Aug. 14-15 at Shilo Country Club.

The new Golf Manitoba/Golf Canada membership card this year will feature the new logos of both the national and provincial organizations of equal size and will include the member's club name. It should be activated to bring benefits and discounts into play. □



Golf Dome continues support of Junior Development Program

This group of young athletes is receiving extensive training which includes mental game preparation, physical fitness assessments and plans, dietary consultation, golf specific coaching, as well as equipment fitting and testing.

Four girls and four boys will be chosen this summer from the Western Canada Games Training Squad to represent Manitoba in Kamloops and it is Golf Manitoba's goal to prepare the potential members of the squad as much as possible.

"Golf Manitoba is extremely proud of the successes we had at the 2009 Canada Summer Games and we are building on that model to prepare our athletes for the Western Canada Games later this year," said **Garth Goodbrandson**, Golf Manitoba's director of player development. "We are able to train a group of young athletes on a long-term basis in preparation for a competitive event. We are hopeful that this will not only benefit the eight members who qualify to represent Manitoba at the Games but also the others who are going through the training. The experiences they are getting will benefit their golf careers for life and the partnership with The Golf Dome allows us to conduct this extensive training year round."

"The Golf Dome has been Winnipeg's premier indoor golf facility since 1991 and we are proud to be associated with Golf Manitoba as the official training site of the Western Canada Games Training Squad," said **Curtis Gray**, president of Golf Dome. "The utilization of The Golf Dome's indoor driving range will allow the team to train in a superior environment and will help assure success of the Golf Manitoba program. □

Toews takes a larger role in Players Cup Tournament



Under new leadership, with more prize money and with hockey star **Jonathan Toews** playing a larger role, the 2011 Canadian Tour Players Cup event will rank as a major golf attraction July 11-17 at the Pine Ridge Golf Club.

Taking over as executive director for the event is **Ryan Hart**, who is also president of the local marketing firm mf.1, which has taken over the operation.

Toews will be involved through the week as the host for the tournament and will be joined by some of his hockey friends and other notables for the Jonathan Toews and Friends Celebrity Pro-Am Tournament on the Tuesday, July 13. Each team will consist of one celebrity, one tour pro and two amateurs.

The traditional Canadian Tour Pro-Am will be played on the

Wednesday with teams comprised of one tour pro and three amateurs.

The 72-hole Players Cup tournament then will be played Thursday to Sunday with an increased purse of \$300,000, up from last year's \$250,000, as well as a berth in the Canadian Open championship for the winner.

It's the second largest event on the Canadian Tour schedule and is expected to attract all of the leading players on the tour since it is also the final event to decide leading money winners who will get invitations to the Canadian Open.

Nicole McMillan, who served as executive director for the tournament in 2010, will be back on the scene as assistant to Hart and husband **Rob McMillan** has been named the honorary chairman and will participate in the tournament. He is the territory manager for Manitoba-Lakehead for Acushnet Canada, Titleist/Footjoy.

Charity will be a major focus for the 2011 Players Cup and Toews will be a big part of that. He will again host the annual Boston Pizza FORE Kids Golf Clinic and is the star attraction for the Winnipeg Free Press Jonathan Toews and Friends Celebrity Pro-Am.

After turning over \$100,000 for The Children's Rehabilitation Foundation last year, the tournament committee pitched Toews on the idea of hosting the entire week.

"Our thinking was, if we raised \$100,000 in a day what could be raise in seven?" said Hart. "We have set an aggressive target to raise a minimum of \$200,000 to be given back to local charity."

The 2010 Players Cup tournament was won by **Aaron Goldberg** and officials anticipate all leading players on the Canadian Tour will be making the trip to Pine Ridge for this year's event and a chance to earn that berth into the Canadian Open. □

Being a Golf Course Superintendent in Manitoba

The Manitoba Golf Superintendents Association (MGSA) would like to congratulate all those who won golf events in 2010 as outlined in this magazine

The 2010 season was just .9mm away from setting the all time record for rain in Winnipeg. That is two rainy seasons back to back. This once again highlights the power of Mother Nature and how weather can impact the most detailed planned events. Some golf properties experienced significant disruption to the game of golf and to golf course maintenance while others experienced minimal disruption.

In looking towards the 2011 season, the goal of this article is to provide the reader information with what is involved in a typical year/season for a Golf Course Superintendent (for use throughout the article GCS will be used). There are numerous responsibilities the GCS must perform annually and specifically here in Manitoba.

This article will focus on three: Provincially, Nationally and Personally.

PROVINCIALY

Here in Manitoba, GCS are required to obtain Manitoba Integrated Pest Manage-

ment (IPM) certification in order to obtain a Manitoba Pesticide Applicators License. These two designations are required by legislation for a golf course to annually apply for a Manitoba Pesticide Use Permit for the current year. This permit allows for the purchase and application of products specifically designed for turfgrass health.

Along with the GCS earning these designations, the golf course must have and proof of Spray Drift Insurance and Liability as well. The costs of renewing licenses each year is \$50 for Pesticide License and currently no annual fee for IPM certification. The pesticide license and IPM certification has to be renewed by GCS every five years. For the pesticide license, GCS have to go through the close book examination process and pay up to \$500. As for IPM recertification GCS have to earn 15 continuing education credits in four categories over five years to renew or repeat the IPM Certification process at a cost of up to \$350. In order to be a GCS member in the MGSA one has to have IPM certification and hold a valid pesticide license.

In addition to the above provincial requirements by the end of the calendar year all golf courses are required to submit the

Post Season Report on Pesticides used for the past season. This report is filled out accordingly by the GCS. In order to provide the necessary information on pesticide use the GCS is responsible for the accurate record keeping of all products applied throughout the season. The majority of products applied to golf courses tends to be late fall and are products used to provide the best prevention of winter turf diseases. GCS have always been and will continue to be stewards of the earth and help to protect our waterways and the environment as a whole.

In addition to the pesticide and IPM upkeep is the attention given to the Manitoba Nutrient Management Plan. All golf courses are to submit nutrient management plans prior to the start of the following season. This involves annual soil testing of areas that receive plant nutrition, nutrient application record keeping and filling out the nutrient management application. It is the responsibility of the GCS to carry out the above mentioned tasks. It is critical that soil tests be taken in fall and prior to freeze up.

GCS can then utilize this information for use the following year and for accurately completing the nutrient management plan application. With this information in hand, it allows the GCS to map out a nutrient management plan and fill out the provincial forms with the necessary information and send in to the Manitoba Environment for approval.

As a member of the MGSA one great benefit is the monthly meetings which provide the opportunity for members to be informed on the trends and responsibilities GCS must be aware of and act upon accordingly in Manitoba. These monthly meetings will be a chance for the GCS to earn the continuing education credits towards renewing the IPM certification.

As well, the MGSA conducts the Manitoba Golf and Turf Conference on an annual basis which provides the best means for GCS and those in the golf course management industry to keep current on industry trends, compliances as well as provides the best means to build upon always important industry network.

NATIONALLY

The Canadian Golf Superintendents Association (CGSA) is the largest association specific to the profession of GCS in Canada. What does this mean to you the reader? The CGSA to the GCS is like Golf Canada (RCGA) to you the golfer. These two national bodies are very important for the business of and great game of golf.

In order to be a GCS member of the CGSA one has to have a valid pesticide license. Belonging to the national association has never been more important than now. With all the changes to the golf course maintenance industry from coast to coast in this country the CGSA is the best hub of information all GCS and ultimately provinces should utilize.

GCS should be a part of the provincial association and the national association and golf courses should be covering the membership fees as a part of the management costs or professional development packages for GCS and the necessary persons on the maintenance teams. For example, here in Manitoba it would cost a GCS \$650 to be a member of both associations. This is a preventative approach to keeping up with the forever changing industry compliances and a small cost to prevent potential major costs of non-compliance. When compared to other professional association memberships, it is on the low end.

PERSONALLY

GCS range in all ages and vary with genders. GCS are sons and daughters, husbands and wives, fathers and mothers, and grandpas and grandmas. For any GCS the number one responsibility is finding a balance from the golf course life to

the personal life. GCS must be able to find the balance between time put in and time away from the golf course. For years (and it continues to be a habit) GCS tend to work seven days a week and will regularly exceed eight hours in a day.

This scenario is not isolated to just the golf course maintenance end but all departments found at a golf facility, such as various club management roles and the golf professionals. This is a continuous career improvement item for any one of the department heads that make up the management team of a golf facility. The theme of doing more with less has never been more prominent in the golf business then now and it can not come at the cost of losing the balance of time put in and time away from the golf facility in any of the management team members at a golf facility.

In conclusion, the first step for anyone becoming a GCS is to join the provincial and national associations (MGSA and CGSA). The mission of the MGSA is this "the Manitoba Golf Superintendents Association is committed to providing education for its members and the golfing public for the preservation and enhancement of golf courses and their environments in Manitoba." There are a lot of requirements to become GCS and there is great benefit in utilizing the associations to assist into becoming one.

All the best to all golfers and may this season be great for the game of golf and golf course maintenance!

Dean North repeats as Pro Player of the Year

Taking top honours in most of the tournaments on the CPGA of Manitoba schedule in the 2010 season, Dean North of the Carman Golf Club was a repeat winner as the association's Pro Player of the Year.

North led the standings throughout the season to amass a total of 301 points and finish well ahead of runner-up Dave Lavallee of the Links at Quarry Oaks, who closed out the season with 284. Scott Borsa, North's assistant pro at Carman, finished third with 265, followed by Andrew Steep of Glendale with 263 and Glen Mills of Assiniboine with 252.

Points were awarded in eligible competitions during the season as the players counted their best three scores in one-round events, points from the three-round Titleist/Footjoy Manitoba PGA championship and points from the two-round Callaway Fall Classic.

North earned 117 points from his one-day events, 126 as the provincial PGA champion and 58 as the runner-up in the Fall Classic. Lavallee had 109 points from the one-day tournaments, 123 as runner-up in the provincial championship and 52 from the Fall Classic.

The successful season started for North at the Nike Cup Spring Kick-Off tournament in May at Teulon, where his 71 was one stroke better than the 72s posted by Wade Nybakken of Niakwa, Darren McMillan of Selkirk and Mike Marion of Bel Acres.

In the Ping June Classic at Bel Acres, North won with 70, a single stroke ahead of six competitors sharing the runner-up honours with 71, included Lavallee, Borsa and Mills, along with Jared Ladobruk of St. Charles, Jason Ludke of Pine Ridge and Gavin March of St. Vital Golf Centre.

The Callaway Open at Transcona saw North on top again with a 69, two better than Greg Love of Pinawa and Joel Rhodes of St. Charles, who tied in the runner-up spot with 71s.

It took a four-hole playoff for North to claim the honours in the TaylorMade Challenge at Rossmere in July as he and Geoff Kehler of St. Boniface both carded 65, five better than Borsa who finished third with 70.

Scores of 71-69-69 for a 54-hole total of 209 at Selkirk earned North the Titleist/Footjoy Manitoba PGA title, three strokes ahead of Lavallee, who had 67-73-72 for 212. Steep was next with 216, followed by Ladobruk with 217 and Shane Dick of Pine Ridge with 219. Lavallee claimed the senior PGA championship with 145, six ahead of Ben Smirnov of John Blumberg, who had 151.

In the Callaway Fall Classic, North had to settle for the runner-up position with his 74-76—150, three behind the winning Ludke who scored 73-74—147 at Glendale in September.

In addition to these events, North's exceptional season on the tournament trail included leading his Carman team to victory in the Pro-Lady tournament, teaming with Borsa to win the Pro-Assistant championship and teaming again with Borsa to finish tied as runners-up in the Pro-Pro Scramble. Derek Ingram and Dave McMillan won that event with 59, with the North/Borsa team tying Glen Mills and Steve Wood with 61s. □

North ranked fifth in national pro listing

Carman's Dean North has landed in fifth place on the inaugural Canadian PGA Player Rankings list. The rankings are based on a hybrid of the world and other national golf rankings and will calculate results on a three-year cycle.

There are five other Manitobans on the list: Brian Guenther of Steinbach (77th), Geoff Kehler of St. Boniface and Shane Dick of Pine Ridge (tied for 78th), Andrew Steep of Glendale (86th) and Scott Parker of Rossmere (96th). □

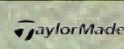

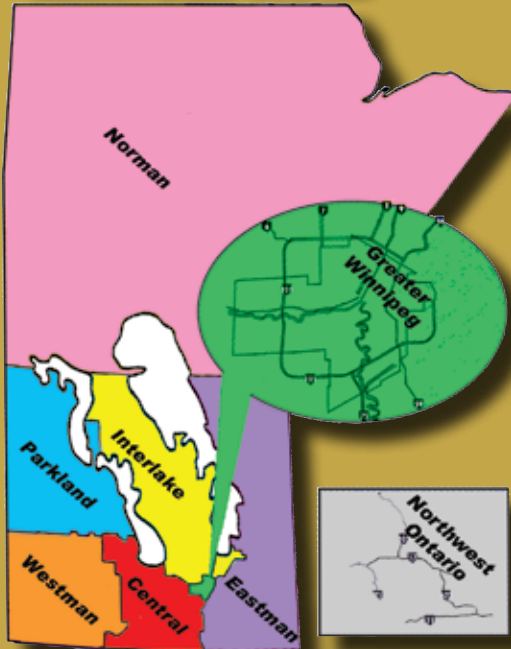
