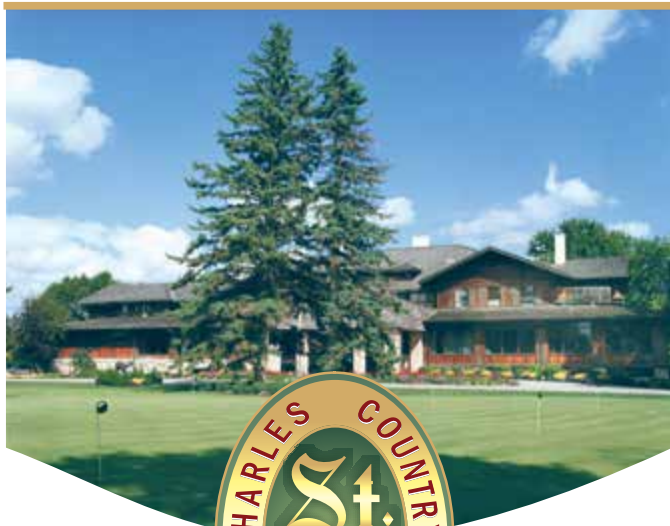

JUNIOR TRAINING SQUADS



Manitoba teams came home with a silver and a bronze from the 2015 Western Canada Summer Games in Fort McMurray, Alta., which is a sign that Golf Manitoba's training program is having its intended effect.

Garth Goodbrandson, who is the province's Director of Player Development, believes the team atmosphere of Manitoba's squads are a big reason why they're a threat to contend at interprovincial and national tournaments.

"People always say in Manitoba we have it more difficult, and in some ways we do," Goodbrandson says. "There's reasons with the weather and whatever, but I always look at with our teams, they really work well as teams. You don't think of golf as a team sport, but those kids that played in the Western Canada Games, they were just so comfortable with each other and they support each other.

"In a golf tournament that's kind of a nice thing, when you've got a group of players who will support each other. I've been very pleased with both the boys' and girls' results in the last two Canada Games. A lot of the reason is because we are probably, of all the provinces, the best team. We have a good environment that way. The players really know each other and support each other."

Golf Manitoba is gearing up for one of the bigger national junior events in which it will have ever competed: the 2017 Canada Summer Games, which will be held in Winnipeg during Canada's 150th birthday year.

The players who trained for last year's Western Canada Summer Games have essentially transitioned into the Canada Summer Games training squad. It consists of 14 boys and 10 girls who will spend the next year working on their games and competing to make the boys' and girls' teams that will compete next summer at Southwood Golf and Country Club.

"Everybody who's trying out is really good and it's going to be pretty tough, but if I was able to (make the team) I'd be really, really excited," says Glenboro's Zach Wytinck, who was a member of the province's Western Canada Summer Games

team last summer. "Especially in Winnipeg, it would be really awesome." Those who qualify for the Canada Games training squad, which is based on their scores in several events, work out at The Golf Dome during the winter and then compete in the Mundie Putter (men) and Nassau (women) leagues to stay in team mode during the summer. Not only do the players work on their games during the indoor sessions, but they also tackle subjects like the rules of golf. They will do fitness training at the Sport For Life Centre in downtown Winnipeg this winter as well.

Wytinck says working out with the training squad is both a competitive and fun environment, and the winter activities keep them sharp 365 days a year.

"Everybody is itching to get back out there (in the spring), and it's nice to have something like that," Wytinck says. "There's lots of good preparation, getting competitive games to do and whatever else. It definitely helps, for sure."

The training will really amp up this winter, and then the players will finally compete to determine who will make up the three-member boys' and girls' teams that will represent Manitoba on its home

turf next August. The training squad members will play at least 10 rounds next spring, and the best seven scores will make up each person's total.

And over the course of the next year, those players will likely get to know each other better than those in the rest of the provinces and territories.

"They might have programs," Goodbrandson says, "but they wouldn't see each other as frequently as we do." He adds the parents of the rural training squad members are a committed group who really put in an effort to get their kids to Winnipeg for all training related events. A fairly small geographical area allows that to happen.

"This is the advantage Manitoba has," Goodbrandson says, "and we have to use that."

Elmhurst's Ryan McMillan and Glendale's Camryn Roadley just missed out on the individual podiums while leading their respective Manitoba teams to medal finishes at the 2015 Western Canada Summer Games in Fort McMurray, Alta.

McMillan placed fourth in the boys' event after shooting rounds of 76-76-77 (229) at Fort McMurray Golf Club, while Roadley shot 79-79-75 (233) to end up fifth in the girls' division.

The Manitoba girls' squad, which also included Erickson's Bobbi Uhl, Winnipeg Beach's Lexie Kopp and Winnipeg's Rebecca Kuik, tied for second with Saskatchewan to earn a silver medal. Kuik finished seventh, Uhl was 12th, and Kopp placed 14th.

The Manitoba boys, meanwhile, finished third behind B.C. and Alberta. The other members of the squad, besides McMillan, were Glenboro's Zach Wytinck (12th), Headingley's Brendan Kesterke (13th) and Selkirk's Wesley Hoydalo (14th).

"It was a great experience," Golf Manitoba Director of Player Development Garth Goodbrandson says. "We were super pleased with both how the boys' and girls' teams did. All our people knew each other, they all got along, and it was a great experience for them."

The 2017 Canada Summer Games aren't the only multi-sport event for which Manitoba's young golfers are busy preparing.

First up is the 2016 Manitoba Summer Games in Steinbach, which will take place Aug. 7-13.

There are eight regions in Manitoba, and each one has a golf professional leading a group of young players who are training in a format similar to that of the Canada Games squad. The Manitoba Summer Games is for boys between 10 and 15 and for girls between 10 and 17. It's essentially the first level of team competition for youngsters.

"It's a step up from grassroots development," says Southwood Golf and Country Club director of instruction Tom Kinsman, who is leading one of the two Winnipeg regional training squads. "You're training the kids to work in a competitive event."

The golfers receive at least 20 hours of instruction and will then compete in a 36 hole qualifying event to determine the teams. The low four boys and low four girls in each region will qualify to play in Steinbach.

"For us to have 26 kids participating in the training (in Winnipeg), and to try to qualify, it's fabulous," Kinsman said. "And if you talk to Dave Scinocca in Brandon, his program is huge."



DEVON SCHADE NAMED MANITOBA MALE GOLFER OF THE YEAR

Devon Schade doesn't go great lengths of time without thinking about – or, more appropriately, is reminded of – July 21, 2015.

“Probably once a week,” Schade says. “Whenever someone asks me about it.”

“It” just so happens to be one of the greatest rounds in the history of the Manitoba men's amateur, which was first held in 1922. Last July, during the second round of the Nott Autocorp Men's Amateur, Schade posted 11 birdies and seven pars en route to a sizzling, 11-under-par 61 at Bridges Golf Course near Starbuck.

Whenever someone brings it up with him, it generally in-

volves one of two questions:

1. What did it feel like?
2. How did you do it?

It felt amazing, of course, and it was just one of those days when Schade was completely in the zone. The Beausejour product remembers every shot from the round, but the one that stands out in his memory bank is his approach on the 18th.

“I was pretty nervous, and I hit it to about ten feet and then made the putt,” says Schade, who is a member of Elmhurst Golf and Country Club.

He was three strokes behind the leader after the first round, but the 61 gave him a six shot

lead and he never looked back after that. He withstood a final round surge from Niakwa's Todd Fanning, who shot 65 on the final day, to win by three.

Schade also captured medalist honours in Manitoba men's match play qualifying, he finished fourth in the Saskatchewan men's amateur, and he tied for 20th at the Canadian university/college championship. Thanks to his strong campaign, he was named Golf Manitoba's male golfer of the year for 2015.

“That was awesome,” Schade said. “It's great to be mentioned, even nominated for it. There's a bunch of great names who have already won it before, so it's great to be named to that group of elite players.”

It's all rather impressive when you consider until recently Schade was basically a hockey player who golfed in the summer. Pucks and sticks were his true passion growing up in Beausejour, and he was good enough that he spent two seasons in the Manitoba Junior Hockey League with the Portage Terriers and Waywayseecappo Wolverines.

He remained on the ice for the past two winters, suiting up for the Manitoba Major Junior Hockey League's Transcona Railers, but somewhere along the way golf took over as his No. 1 sport.

“I was kind of a late bloomer,” says Schade, who turned 21 at the end of May.

In fact, Schade could sense his strong play last summer was coming.

“I just spent a lot more time on the golf course,” he says. “I practised a lot more and was pretty much living at the golf course.”

"I felt that I had a chance to play well in my upcoming tournaments, and I just wanted to prepare myself the best that I could."

Now golf is No. 1 in his life, and who knows where it will take him. He is half way to attaining a business degree from the University of Manitoba, where he plays for the Bisons golf team, and he will spend the 2016 summer defending his amateur crown and chasing other titles. He

plans to play in the prestigious Glencoe Invitational in Calgary and will also tee it up in The Players Cup, the PGA Tour Canada event at Niakwa, after earning a berth through his amateur victory.

He would also like to make the cut at the Canadian amateur, which is something he has failed to do the past two summers when the tournaments were held in Winnipeg (2014) and in Toronto (2015).

Could a professional career be in the offing? Schade can't wait to at least give it a go.

"That's the plan," he says. "Probably after I finish my degree then I'll try and go to Q school for the Canadian Tour."

In the meantime it's all about getting better, because Schade won't be sneaking up on anybody anymore. No longer is he the hockey guy who plays golf. He's now one of the best golfers Manitoba has to offer.

SIX QUESTIONS WITH DEVON SCHADE

Favourite club in your bag?

"It kind of depends on the day, but in general probably my driver. It usually works pretty well."

Favourite Manitoba golf hole?

"Probably No. 14 at Elmhurst. It's a little par-3, a tough par-3. It's got my number. It's tough, but I like it. It's visually nice."

Favourite golf course outside of Manitoba?

"At the Canadian amateur I played at the

Weston Golf Course. That was one of my favourites."

Biggest influence on your golf career?

"Probably my dad (Bruce). He's been teaching me everything he knows since I was a little kid."

Best career round?

"My 61 in the amateur."

What driver is in your bag?

"The TaylorMade R15."

CAMRYN ROADLEY NAMED MANITOBA FEMALE GOLFER OF THE YEAR

Camryn Roadley will always be a part of Manitoba golf history.

That's because the teenager in 2015 became the first winner of Golf Manitoba's Female Golfer of the Year Award.

The Manitoba Golfer of the Year Award was first handed out in 1975, and until 2014 there had been only one trophy up for grabs. That changed last year, when Golf Manitoba decided, in honour of its centennial celebrations, to start offering both a male and female award.

Only five women had won the award in its 40-year history, but Roadley's outstanding performance in 2015 might have made her the sixth if Golf Manitoba hadn't added the female category.

The Glendale Golf and Country Club member kicked off her year by making it to the final of the women's match play championship, and after finishing second in the Accurate Dorwin Women's Junior Championship she went ahead and won the women's amateur at St. Boniface, firing a final round 78 to go from fourth to champion in the span of 24 hours.

"I was really happy with the year," Roadley says. "Some things could've gone better, but overall it was a pretty good year."

Roadley says what really got her season going last year was her victory in the Maple Leaf Junior Tour Saskatchewan Season Opener on May 18 in Swift Current, Sask. Roadley shot 79-75 to edge fellow Winnipegger Kath-

erine McGlenen by one stroke. It was her first Maple Leaf victory after several attempts, and Roadley believes it got the ball rolling.

"From there now I've been able to win other tournaments," Roadley says. "That was kind of like the first tournament I'd really won, so that was definitely a highlight right at the start. And then definitely winning the Manitoba amateur was pretty sweet as well. So those were two pretty good ones."

Roadley also won Maple Leaf tournaments in Yorkton, Sask., and in Teulon to bring her confidence level even higher than it already was.

"There wasn't really any improvement in my game," Roadley says. "I'd been playing really well for a while but just hadn't been able to put everything together until then. Finally I was able to win, and from there it's been easier to kinda believe that I can actually win."

Roadley, who graduated from Sturgeon Heights Collegiate in June, has committed to play her college golf for the North Dakota State University Bison women's team in Fargo. It's an NCAA Division I program that has a dome on campus for winter practising and a full schedule that takes the team all over the United States.

"I really like the coach and the team there, for sure," Roadley says. "The coach (Matt Johnson) came down once, and then I had met him a couple times. It just felt like the right fit. ... Hopefully I'll be able to make the travelling team."

If Roadley has any questions about her transition from Winnipeg to the NCAA, she doesn't even have to leave her house. Her older sister, Jenna, just completed her NCAA career with the Bradley Braves in Peoria, Ill., and is back in Manitoba after graduating from the university in May. The elder Roadley has the ninth lowest stroke average in Braves program history (79.05) and is sixth in sub-80 rounds (59).

Camryn credits Jenna with providing her with guidance and inspiration to get her to where she is in her golf career.

"I bicker a little bit with her because she'll be trying to tell me stuff and then I'm, like, no, I'm doing it right," Camryn says. "But no, it's all good. She's definitely helped a lot, getting to see all her hard work and

everything she's done to get to where she's been has been really valuable."

Roadley isn't sure how many Golf Manitoba events she'll play this year, because she wants to be as ready as she can be for her freshman campaign at NDSU.

"I'd definitely like to be a competitive university player," the

17-year-old says. "I'm trying to finish off my junior career. I've got two more junior years, so I'd like to try and finish off the junior and college years strong, and not sure from there."

She finally got the ball rolling in 2015 and it's going at a pretty high clip right now, so it's unlikely to stop anytime soon.

"I like my putter. I've got a PING Karsten Answer putter."

"I like Selkirk in general, and I like No. 14 at Selkirk. You know there's those holes that you just step up to and you feel like you're going to birdie it? It's one of those ones."

Favourite golf course outside of Manitoba?

"I like Thornhill Golf Course in Ontario."

Biggest influence on your golf career?

"Probably my coaches (Andrew Steep, Jim Steep and Tim Tabor)."

Best career round?

"I'll say 72 at Larters last year."

What driver is in your bag?

"I have a TaylorMade R1."

The Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame and Museum held its 13th annual induction ceremony on Monday, Sept. 28, 2015, at Winnipeg's McPhillips Station Casino.

There were four inductees honoured during this year's event for their accomplishments on and off the golf course: Isa Beirsto, Hal Eidsvig, Len Harvey and Barrie McWha.

Here is a look at their accomplishments:



ISABEL BEAIRSTO



One of the premier female golfers in the province's history, Beirsto captured her first of six Manitoba women's amateur championships in 1925.

She went on to defend her title in 1926 and then won the tournament again in 1931, 1933, 1939 and 1940.

The half dozen Manitoba women's amateur titles means Beirsto is tied with Marg Homenuik and Aileen Robertson for the most in the province's history.

The St. Charles member dominated the City & District championship as well during her impressive run, winning that tournament seven times in her career between 1925 and 1937.

Beirsto continued her impressive play at the next level, vanquishing

the field to take home the Manitoba senior women's crown in 1946.

She was also the women's club champion at St. Charles a whopping 13 times in her life.

HAROLD (HAL) EIDSVIG



Harold Eidsvig enjoyed a remarkable golf career as both an amateur and a professional for the better part of a decade in Manitoba. Born in St. James-Assiniboia, he developed his love for the game as a caddie at St. Charles in the late 1920s. Eidsvig's relatively late start in golf at age 18 in 1932 makes his achievements even more remarkable.

He captured two Manitoba men's amateur championships and four Manitoba Open titles between 1946 and 1955. The first amateur crown came in 1946 and was followed up

with a double as Manitoba amateur and Open champ in 1947.

Eidsvig turned pro at Assiniboine Golf Club the following year and marked the 1948 Canadian Open as one of his fondest memories. He reclaimed the Manitoba Open title in 1949 and was instrumental in the formation of the Manitoba Professional Golf Association, according to local golf historian Al Hackett in his book *Manitoba Links: A Kaleidoscopic History of Golf*.

When George Daniel retired after the 1949 season, Eidsvig took over as pro at Niakwa, a position he held from 1950 to 1959. During that tenure he captured his third (1952) and fourth (1955) Manitoba Open titles.

LEONARD HARVEY



Len Harvey earned his place in the provincial golf spotlight by winning

the Manitoba Open championship as an amateur in 1953. He became a professional and returned to claim another Manitoba Open title as a pro in 1954.

He then worked in pro shops and claimed his first head professional posting at Assiniboine Golf Club from 1958 to 1960. He moved to St. Boniface Golf Club from 1961 to 1965 and to Pine Ridge Golf Club in 1966 and 1967. He then moved away from Manitoba in 1967 to take on head professional duties at Regina's Wascana Country Club in Regina until 1980, when he headed further west to live in British Columbia.

He showed his playing ability again in 1967 by winning the Saskatchewan Open championship. He also represented Canada in international competitions, at the Carling World matches at Royal Birkdale in England and at the Board of Trade Golf Club in Toronto.

Golf was a year round activity for Harvey, as he spent 28 years teaching during the winter months in Phoenix, Ariz. He joined the Canadian Professional Golfers Association in 1954 and served on several committees in both Manitoba and Saskatchewan.

He served as club professional and teaching pro at various locations in B.C., including Predator Ridge Golf Resort between Kelowna and Vernon, where he was teaching at the time of his induction.

BARRIE McWHA



For nearly 50 years, Barrie McWha has made his mark as a builder of golf across western Canada. He first attracted attention in 1967 when he joined the Canadian Professional Golfers Association as an apprentice under head professional Bill Thomson at Southwood Golf and Country Club.

He attended the first business school, organized by the PGA of America, in 1968 and was named head professional of the Wilde-

wood Club in Winnipeg in 1969. He then moved west to serve as assistant professional at Calgary Golf and Country Club in 1970 and in 1971 at the Canyon Meadows Golf Club before returning to Winnipeg in 1973 as head professional at Southwood, succeeding the retiring Thomson.

He was elected president of the CPGA of Manitoba in 1977 and went to the CPGA Board of Directors in 1981. He served a two-year term as President of the CPGA in 1983-84. He was named Southwood's General Manager and head professional in 1985, but not before being named Manitoba's head professional of the year in 1981 and shooting a Southwood course record 64 in 1979.

McWha also played a major role in the growth of the Manitoba Open championship from 1985 to 1990 at Southwood.

McWha moved to B.C. in 1990 and has held several roles in that province, from Director of Golf at Fairwinds Golf Resort to Manager of the PGA of B.C. trade show to leading a revitalization of Pheasant Glen Golf Resort. He also served as Executive Director of the B.C. Golf House Society between 2008 and 2012.

The University of Manitoba Bisons men's golf team knew it was going to be in tough at last year's Canadian university/college championships.

The Bisons won the 2014 championship on their home turf, but two key members of the team, Josh Wytinck and Bryce Barr, graduated. That meant a relatively in-experienced group went to Guelph, Ont., to defend the title.

Manitoba failed to make the 54-hole cut as a team, ending up in 13th spot when only the top 10 qualified for the final round.

Charlie Boyechko, one of three returning members of the defending championship squad, was the top Bisons player in the individual portion of the event. He tied for sixth at Cutten Fields after firing 74-69-72-71, which worked out to a 6-over-par 286 total. That was only six shots back of the champion, UBC's Evan Holmes.

Devon Schade also made the 54-hole individual cut, and he finished in a tie for 20th after shooting 79-73-68-73.

Scott Mazur, another returning player, just missed the cut after shooting 78-74-75. The third returning player, Brodie Gobin (79-83-79), and Ryan Dirr (82-79-84) also played only three rounds.

The Herd had a pretty good fall campaign in 2015, competing in eight events and winning two of them. Here are the highlights:

- Two Manitoba squads competed in the two day Augsburg Fall Invitational to kick off the season Sept. 5 and 6. The first team placed seventh, while the second squad ended up tying for 15th. The top individual was Schade, whose 77-69 landed him in 10th spot.

- The two Bisons teams then took part in the NDSU Fall Kickoff on Sept. 7, and Aaron McIntyre claimed medallist

honours with a 2-under-par 70. Schade was the runner-up after a 72. The Bisons second team placed second among the four participants, while the first squad ended up in third.

- The first Bisons team won the Battle of the Falls tournament in Larchwood, Iowa, which took place Sept. 13 and 14, and they topped eight other squads in the process. Noel Ngo placed second individually after shooting 72-78-72. Schade was third (75-76-73).

- The second Bisons team was the runner-up in the four team Bemidji State Invitational on Sept. 13 and 14. Tyler Hall (76-72) tied for third to earn top Bison honours.

- The Bisons placed first and third at the Jamestown Invitational that took place Sept. 20 and 21. The first team won the tournament, while the second one ended up in the bronze medal position among the 13 participants. Josh Neufeld finished second with a 1-over-par total of 145 (75-70).

- The Bisons placed fifth among 19 squads at the Twin Cities Classic in Minneapolis on Sept. 26. Schade (74-75-68) placed fourth individually. Neufeld (75-71-77) tied for 12th, Jeff Bleue (78-76-71) tied for 18th, Ngo (75-82-82) tied for 65th, and Steve Young (83-84-77) tied for 82nd.

- Manitoba finished fifth among 11 teams at the St. Cloud State Huskies Invite on Sept. 28. Gobin (74-70) led the Bisons with a second place showing, followed by Jack Werhun (T18), McIntyre (T30), Hall (T32), Bobby McNair and Derek Solman (T38), and Avery Livingston (T43).

- Manitoba grabbed fourth place among 11 teams at the Vikes Shootout in Victoria in mid-October. Neufeld, in a tie for seventh, was the top Manitoba golfer. Schade tied for 18th, Ngo tied for 24th, Bleue tied for 28th, and Gobin finished 50th.

DEVON SCHADE CLAIMS MEN'S AMATEUR HONOURS

One magical round was all it took for Devon Schade to claim the Nott Autocorp Manitoba Men's Amateur Championship trophy in 2015.

The Elmhurst Golf and Country Club member fired a course record 11-under-par 61 at Bridges Golf Course in the second round of the four round event and held on for a three shot victory over former Canadian Tour professional Todd Fanning.

Schade, who hails from Beausejour, carded 11 birdies and seven pars during his memorable round, which took him from three shots back after Round 1 to having a six shot advantage at the tournament's midway point. He was 13 shots worse in the third round, but that was still a very respectable score of 2-over-par 74, and he had stretched his lead to nine after those chasing him fell off the pace.

Breezy Bend's Eric Johnson was six shots back after two

rounds, but he ballooned to a third round 79. Breezy Bend's Allan McDonald was tied with Fanning, nine back of Schade, through two rounds, but he also shot 79 in Round 3.

Fanning, who plays at Niakwa, made a huge charge on the final day, firing a blistering 7-under-par 65 to get to within three of Schade, who shot a cool 73 to capture his first Nott Autocorp Manitoba Men's Amateur title.

"I was picking and choosing when to go for things and when to hold back. I did a good job of that," Schade told reporters after his win. "It's pretty unbelievable. It's a big stepping stone in my career. It's something I've wanted to win for a couple of years now, and I can't believe that I've finally done it."

Schade's four day total was 7-under 281, while Fanning checked in at 4-under 284. Teulon's Ryan Sholdice (79-67-71-69) finished all alone in third at 2-under 286.



Schade, Sholdice and Elmhurst's Zach Sackett served as Team Manitoba members for the Willingdon Cup at the Canadian men's amateur in Toronto, and they placed fifth in the 12 team field, which included Yukon and Northwest Territories.

None of the 11 Manitobans in the field made the 36-hole cut at the Weston and Lambton Golf and Country Clubs. Johnson came the closest, firing 75-73 to miss by one. Sackett was two back of the cut line after shooting 75-74.

CAMRYN ROADLEY CLAIMS WOMEN'S AMATEUR HONOURS

Camryn Roadley was on the outside looking in when the final round of the Manitoba women's amateur championship began on July 8.

By the end of the day, she was on the top of the mountain looking down at everyone else. The 16-year-old Glendale Golf and Country Club member fired a final round 78 at St. Boniface Golf Club to win the championship by three strokes over Southwood's Rhonda Orr. Roadley posted a three day total of 19 over par after shooting 82 and 81 in her first two rounds.

Roadley was all alone in fourth place going into the final round, two shots back of Southwood's Veronica Vetesnik and Steinbach Fly-In Golf Club's Charmaine Mackid. Vetesnik finished with an 84 to end up all alone in third place, while Mackid, who is from Ste. Anne, struggled to a 91 and placed fifth.

Roadley was playing in the second last group during the final round, but it turned out she and Orr, who was in the final grouping, were tied with nine holes to play. Roadley made her move on the par-5 10th hole at St. Boniface, producing an eagle that would ultimately provide two thirds of the winning margin.

Vetesnik led after the first round thanks to a tournament best 3-over-par 77, which gave her a three stroke edge over Mackid.

Vetesnik, Mackid and Niakwa's Rebecca Kuik, who placed fourth in the provincial championship, represented Manitoba at the Canadian women's amateur championship at Saskatoon's Riverside Country Club. They finished eighth out of eight participating teams with a two round total of 52-over 340.

Vetesnik (87-80), Mackid (91-84) and Kuik (98-82) all missed



the individual cut at the national championship. St. Boniface's Mindy Lichtman (82-80), Elmhurst's Bri-ann Tokariwski (82-80), along with a trio of St. Charles members, Hannah Diamond (94-84), Dana Todd (87-92) and Katherine McGlenen (94-97), also missed the cut.

This year's Manitoba women's amateur is slated for Breezy Bend Country Club July 4-6.

VERONICA VETESNIK CLAIMS WOMEN'S JUNIOR HONOURS

Veronica Vetesnik made winning look easy at the Accurate Dorwin Junior Women's Championship in 2015.

The Southwood Golf and Country Club member cruised to her second straight provincial title at Transcona and Elmhurst, finishing nine shots clear of Glendale's Camryn Roadley.

Vetesnik, who won the 2014 championship by five strokes, has attended high school in the United States in an effort to improve her golf skills, and it paid off again last summer. All three of her scores were in the 70s, including a final round 77 that capped her victory.

Vetesnik shot 74, 76 and 77, while Roadley produced rounds of 81, 75 and 80 to end up six shots ahead of the third place finisher, Brynn Todd of St. Charles.

Vetesnik started the final round at Elmhurst with a six shot advantage, but not even three straight bogeys to start the day could put a damper on things. That's because Roadley was having her own troubles, double bogeying the first and adding bogeys on Nos. 3, 4 and 5 to keep the margin a wide one between first and second.

Vetesnik was solid as a rock on the back nine, making eight pars and a bogey to stroll to the crown.

Todd produced rounds of 86, 75 and 81 en route to her third place showing.

The top three finishers also comprised Team Manitoba at the Canadian junior women's championship in Yorkton, Sask., and they fared quite well; they placed fourth among nine squads.



Vetesnik tied for 28th overall as an individual, shooting 75, 78, 83 and 77. Todd and Erickson's Bobbi Uhl tied for 53rd, while Roadley finished 57th all by herself. St. Charles' Katherine McGlenen also earned the right to play the final two rounds and placed 68th.

Niakwa's Rebecca Kuik and Selkirk's McKyla Poponick missed the 36-hole cut.

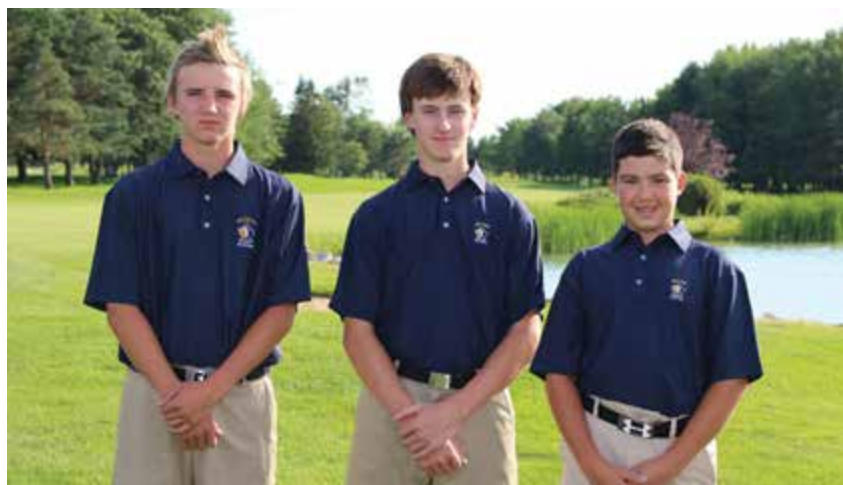

Orr, meanwhile, carded a 1-over-par 38 on the back nine and ended up finishing only five strokes back thanks to a final round 77. Gibson shot 86 in the last round for a three day total of 24-over 240.

Karen Saarimaki of Kenogamis Golf Club in Geraldton, Ont., which is an 11 hour drive to the east of Winnipeg, placed third at 254 (86-84-84).

Gibson, Orr and Stonewall's Barb Lafleche, who finished fourth at provincials, made up Team Manitoba at the Canadian senior women's championship in Camlachie, Ont., in late August. Manitoba tied for fifth in the eight team event with a two day total of 42-over-par 326.



Orr tied for eighth in the individual portion of the tournament, shooting 78-78-73 to finish 19 strokes back of the winner. Gibson shot 83-91-86 and tied for 64th. Lafleche just missed the cut after rounds of 92 and 87.

This year's Manitoba senior women's championship will be held July 25-27 at Glendale Golf and Country Club.

GARTH COLLINGS CLAIMS MEN'S SENIOR HONOURS

It was tough sledding at the Manitoba senior men's championship in 2015, but Garth Collings' experience shone through in the end.

The Breezy Bend member, who is one of the most accomplished golfers in Manitoba history, prevailed with an 8-over-par 224 total at Niakwa Country Club, which was good for a four shot victory over Transcona's Mike Berney and Niakwa's Ken Warwick.

Collings fired rounds of 74, 74 and 76 to win his second provincial senior men's crown in three years. He trailed Warwick by one after the first round, but he enjoyed a three shot advantage over Berney and a four shot cushion over Warwick going into the final round.

Even though Collings bogeyed two holes on the front

nine of the third and final round, Berney and Warwick both put three bogeys on their cards and failed to make a push.

Warwick's opening round 73 was the best score of the week, as none of the 65 competitors was able to shoot par or better on the 6,092 yard course.

Collings, Berney and Warwick represented Manitoba at the Canadian senior men's championship in Medicine Hat, Alta., where they had a fine showing. They finished fourth in the nine province field with a 6-over-par total of 294 over two rounds at Desert Blume Golf Club.

Collings and Warwick were the top Manitobans individually, as they tied for 32nd. Collings shot 74-74-77, while Warwick carded



rounds of 71-75-79 during the event, which was shortened by one round due to strong winds. Berney also made the cut and tied for 66th after shooting 74-80-82. Elmhurst's Ted Hunt shot 84-90 to miss the cut by 19 strokes.

This year's Manitoba senior men's championship will be played July 25-27 at Glendale Golf and Country Club.

It looked like Jay Doyle was nothing if not a model of consistency in capturing the Manitoba men's mid-amateur championship in 2015.

The Niakwa Country Club member opened with a 1-over-par 73 at St. Boniface Golf Club, followed that up with a 1-over-par 73 and finished it off with a 1-over-par 73 for a two stroke victory over Pine Ridge's Mike Tibbs (74-74-73).

Then again, looks can be deceiving, because there was nothing consistent about Doyle's final round. He struggled to a 41 on the front nine, while Tibbs turned in an even-par 36. That's all the momentum Doyle needed, because he proceeded to make four birdies over the final eight holes to win by a pair. Oliphant faded as well, shooting 39 on the back to tie for third with Breezy Bend's Garth Collings and Eric Johnson at 223 - four strokes back of Doyle and two behind Tibbs.

Interestingly, no player was able to break par during the three day tournament. Four players carded even par 72s, but no one posted a red figure.

Doyle, Tibbs and Johnson represented Manitoba at the Canadian men's mid-amateur championship in New Glasgow, N.S., in late August, and the province finished sixth in the 10 province field with a 19 over 299 total over two days.

Breezy Bend's Justin McDonald played in the tournament as an individual and tied for fourth after shooting rounds of 74-71-



72-72. Collings shot 69-73-77-71 to place sixth.

Doyle tied for 27th (75-75-73-76), Johnson tied for 29th (73-79-73-76), and Tibbs tied for 47th (72-79-75-79) as members of Team Manitoba.

This year's Manitoba men's mid-amateur championship will be contested at Breezy Bend Country Club July 4-6.

The Elmhurst Golf and Country Club member captured her fourth straight Manitoba women's match play championship in 2015, leaving a pair of Roadleys in her wake.

Tokariwski not only won the 36-hole final match 5 and 3 over 16-year-old Camryn Roadley of Glendale at Pine Ridge Golf Club, she also captured medallist honours after posting qualifying rounds of 73 and 74 at Winkler Golf Club. That was one stroke better than Roadley, who shot 72-76 to land in the runner-up position.

Tokariwski began to methodically take out her opponents, eliminat-

ing Shilo's Hayley Shanks 9 and 7, and Maplewood's Tammy Gibson 7 and 6 to reach the semifinals. That's where Tokariwski met Camryn's older sister, Jenna.

Tokariwski's match play prowess once again proved to be too much for the elder Roadley, as the three time defending champ cruised to a 3 and 2 triumph.

On the other side of the draw, Camryn Roadley beat Lexie Kopp of Links at the Lake 7 and 6 before needing two extra holes to dispatch St. Charles' Hannah Diamond. Roadley then needed two overtime holes again to vanquish her semifinal opponent, Winnipeg's Veronica Vetesnik.

That's bad news for everyone else in the field, because Elmhurst is Tokariwski's home track.

JUSTIN MCDONALD CLAIMS MEN'S MATCH PLAY HONOURS

For someone who didn't even qualify to play in the matches, Breezy Bend's Justin McDonald sure fared pretty well in the 2015 Manitoba men's match play championship.

McDonald initially missed the top 32 qualifying spots by one stroke, but thanks to a couple of dropouts he moved into the 32nd and final position on the match tree. That got McDonald a battle with medallist Devon Schade, and he rolled to a 7 and 6 upset victory.

It turns out all McDonald needed was a chance, because he took it and ran with it all the way to the first major championship of the 2015 season. McDonald rattled off four more victories to claim the title, beating fellow Breezy Bend golfer Allan McDonald (no relation) in the 36-hole final.

Maybe that's the way Justin McDonald should go about the match play qualifying from here on out. He was the medallist in 2012 but dropped the final to Aaron Cockerill.

Justin McDonald shot 79-76 at Winkler Golf Club during the qualifying rounds to tie for 33rd. Elmhurst's Schade, meanwhile, carded an opening round 72 and followed that up with a blistering six-under-par 65 to capture medallist honours by three strokes over Allan McDonald, who shot 70-70. Elmhurst's Christy O'Donnell placed third after firing 70-72 for an even par total of 142.

After Justin McDonald steamrolled over Schade in the opening round of match play at Pine Ridge, he edged Niakwa's Bryce Barr 2 and 1, he thumped Niakwa's Daniel Munroe 7 and 6, and he cruised past Shilo's Brad Pardy 5 and 3 in the



semifinal round.

Allan McDonald, meanwhile, beat Golf Manitoba's Josh Neufeld (2 up), Breezy Bend's Jesse Skelton (3 and 1), Pine Ridge's Noel Ngo (3 and 2) and Quarry Oaks' Stefan Lavallee (4 and 3) to reach the final.

This year's match play championship qualifying will take place at Transcona Golf Club May 28 and 29, with the matches slated for Elmhurst Golf and Country Club June 4, 5, 8, 9 and 11.

JENNA ROADLEY CLAIMS WOMEN'S CITY AND DISTRICT HONOURS

In an effort to ensure no one would go lower than her, Jenna Roadley went under par to capture the annual Women's City and District Championship.

The Glendale Golf and Country Club member, who this year completed her collegiate career at Bradley University in Peoria, Ill., carded rounds of 74 and 71 at Teulon Golf and Country Club for a two round total of 1-under-par 145.

Roadley's score was good for a six shot triumph over four

time Manitoba women's amateur champ, Southwood's Jill Hardy-Gingras, who matched Roadley's final round 71 but opened instead with an 80 that left her well off the pace.

Roadley's final round consisted of one eagle, three birdies, one bogey and one double bogey. Hardy-Gingras produced four birdies and two bogeys en route to her 2-under-par score.

St. Charles Country Club's Dana Todd ended up in third after carding back-to-back rounds of 78, while defending



champion Bri-ann Tokariwski of Elmhurst placed fourth in the 10-player field with rounds of 82 and 75.

This year's City and District Championship will take place June 22 and 23 at Transcona Golf Club.

TOM HUMNISKI CLAIMS SENIOR MEN'S MATCH PLAY HONOURS

It turned out Tom Humniski was simply lurking in the weeds, waiting to strike when the irons got hot.

The Elmhurst Golf and Country Club golfer shot unassuming rounds of 81 and 82 during qualifying for last year's inaugural Manitoba senior men's match play championship and was seeded 14th out of 16 qualifiers.

Humniski then got going, rattling off four consecutive victories to become the province's first senior men's match play winner. He beat Breezy Bend's Mark Olson 3 and 2 in the 18 hole final at Pine Ridge Golf Club to become the first player to put his name on the trophy.

Olson captured medallist honours at Winkler Golf Club, turning in rounds of 77 and 72 to edge Niakwa's Ken Warwick and Elmhurst's Alan Brownridge by one stroke.

Humniski started churning out the upsets on the other side of the draw with a 3 and 2 triumph over Brownridge, and then he downed Transcona's Steve Wallace 2 and 1 in the quarter-final round. Humniski met seventh seed Keith Fawcett of Selkirk in the semifinal round and emerged with a 1 up victory.

Olson opened with a 4 and 2 win over Brian McClintock of Links at the Lake, and followed it up with a 2 up victory over Steinbach's Al Kehler. Olson



scored a 1 up win over Transcona's Mike Berney to advance to the inaugural final.

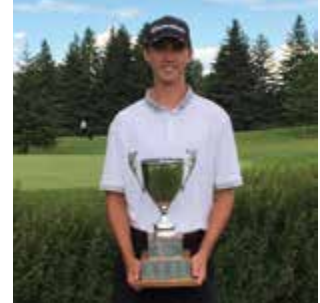

A couple of years ago in the Manitoba Golfer we brought you a story titled: "Where in the World is Derek Ingram?"

Well, this summer the Winnipeg golf instructor will be on the world's biggest sporting stage, coaching the Canadian men's golf team at the Summer Olympics in Rio de Janeiro.

"I'm really looking forward to it," Ingram says. "It's kinda been on my radar for probably five or six years, maybe even a year or two before golf was accepted into the Olympics. There was a lot going on to try and get it into the Olympics, and I felt like it would. So it's been a target for me for a long time, and I'm excited."

Ingram is a man of many hats. He is not only Golf Canada's men's team coach, but he also runs the Team Canada Young Pro Squad, a program aimed at getting Canada's top amateur golfers on to professional tours.

So he's the perfect man to lead Canada into the Olympics, where golf will be played for the first time in more than 100 years. In fact, the last time the sport was part of the Olympics was in 1904.

The Canadian men's team will consist of the top two Canucks on the world golf ranking as of July 11. It will very likely be Graham DeLaet of Weyburn, Sask., and David Hearn of Brantford, Ont., and Ingram is familiar with both.

In fact, no matter who ends up comprising Canada's two man squad, Ingram won't have to spend much time getting to know them.

"I don't personally coach Graham DeLaet or David Hearn, but I know those guys very well," says Ingram, who went to The Memorial and to the RBC Heritage earlier this year to catch up with Canada's top pros. "Certainly I'll be very comfortable at the Olympics coaching them, and Nick Taylor I coached for years and years. I know him extremely well if he happens to qualify. Adam Hadwin as well, I've coached him on our amateur team, so I feel very comfortable there."

Ingram went to Brazil in March for a test event at Reserva di Marapendi, the golf course where the tournament will be held. In fact, he was one of only a few who went, which Ingram believes will greatly help Canada's medal chances.

"There was only myself, the head coach of the women's program and Paul McGinley from Ireland," Ingram says. "And we actually walked with Paul for a few holes. There were not a lot of other coaches that went to the test event, and that really gave us a leg up on the competition in terms of being prepared and knowing the lay of the land. That'll be very useful."

Golf will always be an individual game, so Canada's golfers will have to play some good golf on their own. That being said, Ingram will expect - and encourage - them to soak up the Olympic experience, because national pride will be the intangible that could put them over the top.

"They will want to stir themselves into the Olympic atmosphere, because they're hockey guys and they've seen Team Canada hockey in the Olympics ... so



they're going to want to embrace that part of it, and that's going to be great for them and for our chances," Ingram says.

"In preparation, all those players are focused on getting into the top 50 in the world rankings and into the majors and into the World Golf Championships, so that's a top priority for them. But as soon as you get selected to the Olympic team, you're start focusing on, 'Geez, that's something I really want to do well in.' Imagine being a medal winner at the Olympics for the first time golf's been in the Olympics in 100 years. You have a chance to be part of some really big history."

Ingram sees no reason why the Canadian men can't come home with a medal or even win the whole thing.

"There's a lot of great players, but if we can have both of our players in the mix to medal, I like the chances of getting a medal," he says. "The field isn't as deep as a major. There aren't 144 of the best players in the world. There's only 72, and frankly of those 72 some of them are from some weaker countries, so I really feel there's an even better chance for us to medal."

It will be a very exciting time for the sport, and Ingram gets to be a part of it. He won't be thinking too much about that aspect of his adventure before the event, but he knows it'll be something he'll never forget.

"It was never my goal to go to the Olympics," he says. "It's been my goal to help Canada medal at the Olympics. And there's a big difference there. I'm not just satisfied going there and participating. I've never been about that. Our national team's never been about that. We were second in the world am last year. We're there to win. That's the bottom line.

"So the preparation I've been doing has really been focusing on how we can help our athletes have a really good chance to win and what sorts of value I can bring to the table to assist them. After I'll be able to reflect and go, 'That was really cool.'"

Slowly but surely, Winnipeg's Derek Ingram is trying to change the attitude of Canada's professional golfers.

As the men's coach of the Team Canada Young Pro Squad, Ingram is trying to instil a feeling of confidence among the players who are trying to climb their way on to the PGA Tour.

"We're trying to stop that 'nice guy Canada' routine," Ingram said. "We want to win and we want to be first class about it, but we're there to do really well. We're not there to compete. No B.S. We're there to win.

"So that philosophy is the big thing that changed. And then we're constantly adding new things, adapting and adjusting our best practices to get better and better. We're leaving no rocks unturned. We're spending every waking moment as a golfing country trying to accelerate our programs to the highest level."

This year's team consists of four men and two women who are trying to reach their respective top tours. Toronto's Albin Choi, Mackenzie Hughes of Dundas, Ont., Taylor Pendrith of Richmond Hill, Ont., and Corey Conners of Listowel, Ont., are the male members of the squad, and they're playing on various tours, including the Web.com Tour. They receive funding and coaching support throughout the year.

Ingram, who spends more than half his year on the road due to his responsibilities, believes Golf Canada's efforts will result in more Canadians playing on the world's most prestigious and wealthy tours.

"We're starting to build a wider base of great players in Canada that will have a chance to get to the Web.com Tour and the PGA Tour," he says.

Rewards for playing golf and posting scores – Through the generosity of partners such as Taylor-Made-adidas and others, members are eligible to win prizes with every score posted to the Golf Canada Score Centre. In 2015 more than 600 prizes,

such as equipment, merchandise and achievement bag tags, were awarded.

Golf Canada reports that nearly a century ago about 90% of golfers belonged to a golf club. These days that number has dipped to about 10%. The stats show golf remains Canada's most popular sport to play, but people want to play many courses instead of buying a course membership and feeling the pressure to play only there to get their money's worth.

Right now there are two levels of Golf Canada's new membership model: a free bronze level and a gold level worth \$49.95. If you are a member of a golf club, it may or may not purchase your Golf Canada card as part of your membership. The golf course at Niakwa underwent major renovations that were completed in 2013, and now the club is thriving thanks to solid membership numbers, a strong junior program and the hosting of several major events.

"It's going to be a lot of fun," Nybakken says. "We're really looking forward to it. The members are excited. We're excited to watch them play our course and show them what we've been doing at Niakwa."

The board once again is continually working with all government branches to improve our reporting processes and the continuing education IPM points. For those individuals needing IPM points our annual conference is booked from Nov 16-18 2016. For any golf courses that do not currently belong to the MGSA we encourage you to join our association. We are here to help guide you through all your environmental concerns and licensing issues.

The MGSA has been working with Clean Farms Canada to create a pesticide recycling container program to ensure that containers are being recycled in the appropriate manner and in an easier and more cost effective way than our current practices. The MGSA remains committed to environmental stewardship and the responsible use of pesticides and the related recycling of the containers.

The MGSA and Red River College have completed year 3 of our four year study monitoring hourly temperature, relative humidity and gas levels under three different winter covering systems at four courses throughout the province. Thank you to Elmhurst, Bel Acres, St. Charles, and Boissevain for your support. Red River College has collected all the data from this past winter and will be compiling the results over the next month or so. We look forward to seeing the data. The Pinawa data collection has been removed this year due to animal damage and was placed at Elmhurst.

I once again would like to say this message, please the next time you see your golf course superintendent, thank them for the work he or she does and all their staff. DEAN NORTH PGA OF MANITOBA PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Another year, another PGA of Manitoba golfer of the year title for Dean North.

Ho-hum.

The general manager at Carman Golf and Curling Club sizzled on the links again in 2015, and he took home the top player honour for the sixth time in the last seven years. He has captured the award 11 times in his career, including seven of the last 10 years.

"I love competition, so just the fact of getting out and playing against guys and challenging myself, I just love it," North says. "So maybe that's what allows me to keep playing well."

North got his 2015 season started on the right foot when he fired a final round 69 to win the SunIce Spring Championship at Larters at St. Andrews in late May. He nipped Elmhurst's Derek Ingram by two strokes.

He then easily won his second straight tournament on his home course, shooting a blistering 65 to capture the Callaway June Classic by six strokes.

North placed third in the Titleist Footjoy PGA Championship at Elmhurst and then lost in a four-hole playoff to Quarry Oaks' Dave Lavallee at the season

ending TaylorMade/Adidas/Ashworth/Adams Fall Championship at Southwood.

Even though he didn't win the two big events at the end of the season, the pair of top three finishes was more than enough to leave him on top of the points standing.

"The other big thing that went well for me last year was a I made a putter change, and I really putted well," North says. "I went back to conventional putting style with my grip and stuff. And then I just found a putter that sat really well for me and just felt great off the face. I made a lot of putts last year."

Before that, the putting stroke North used might have depended on the day of the week.

"I was tinkering, like every golfer, trying left hand low and some other different things," he says. "A longer putter and sometimes a little shorter putter. I've tried it all, I think."

North's strong play is even more impressive considering he hardly has time to play anymore. His GM duties in Carman keep him hopping, and the number of times he gets to play every week has been dropping in recent years.



That has forced him to work even more on the mental side of his game, which he must be doing quite well.

"With my role as the general manager out here I don't get an opportunity to go out every day like I used to," he says, "but I still think good thoughts a lot of the time, and if you can think the right thoughts that's half the battle."

North said Carman's course wintered remarkably well, and another highlight of the clubhouse is the presence of McGee's Restaurant, which takes care of the food and beverage operations at the course.

"She has quality food and great service," North says, "and that's going to help our facility a lot."

MACKENZIE TOUR NOTES

It wasn't exactly a banner year for Manitobans on the Mackenzie Tour-PGA Tour Canada in 2015.

Stony Mountain's Aaron Cockerill was the top Manitoban on the tour's order of merit, but he was well out of contention to keep his card at 172nd spot. Cockerill, who failed to earn his card via the B.C. qualifying school, played in two events and made the cut in one, tying for 47th in the Times Colonist Open in Victoria and earning \$627.81.

Glenboro's Josh Wytinck played in one event, The Players Cup at Pine Ridge, and missed the cut after shooting 77-72.

The 2016 started much better for Cockerill, who earned his card through the B.C. qualifying school with a 15th place finish. Wytinck and Winnipeg's Charlie Boyechko failed to earn their cards.

The Players Cup is on the move, going from Pine Ridge Golf Club to Niakwa Country Club for this year only. Manitoba's Mackenzie Tour stop will return to Pine Ridge in 2017.

"The level of enthusiasm around the tournament's probably greater than it's ever been," Mackenzie Tour president Jeff Monday says. "You see that at all sorts of tournaments since we've been up here. As the impact of the event in the community continues to grow, it's one of those things that builds momentum.

"What Ryan (Hart) and the team has done has been pretty impressive. From a volunteer interest, from a sponsor interest and from a fan interest we're hopeful and anticipating this will be the best year ever and then be able to build on that when it goes to Pine Ridge back in 2017."

Manitoba last November lost one of the

greatest golfers it has ever produced when Dan Halldorson passed away after suffering a stroke.

He was 63 years old. The Mackenzie Tour has come up with a way to honour Halldorson, who served on the loop's executive for several years after his playing days were done. The tour's top Canadian each year will receive the Dan Halldorson Trophy along with a \$25,000 bonus.

"Dan cared deeply about Canadian players following their dreams of making it to the PGA Tour and always wanted to do whatever he could to help them get there," Halldorson's widow, Pat, said in a press release. "Even though he played professional golf all over the world, Canada was always his home and he never forgot that.

"It means so much to our family that this award will continue in his name."

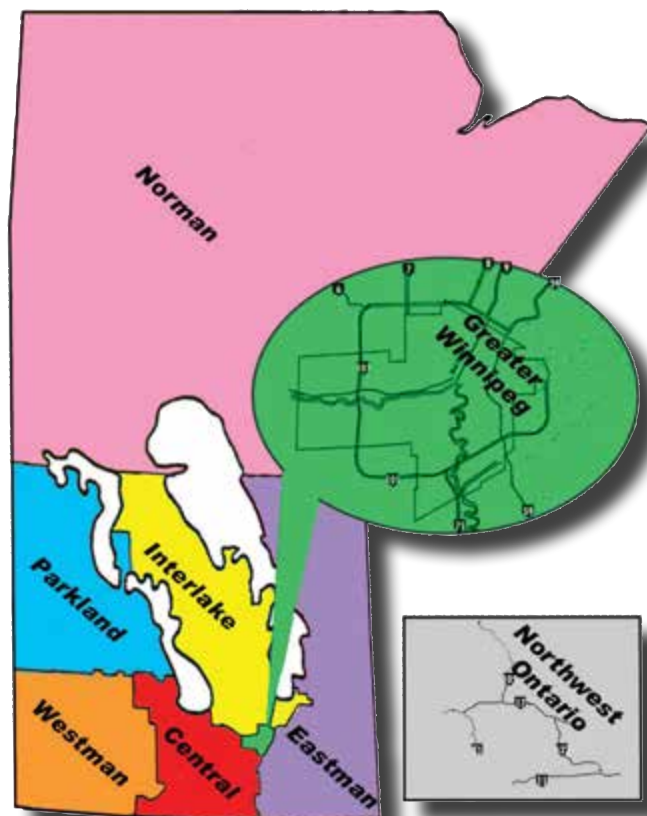
