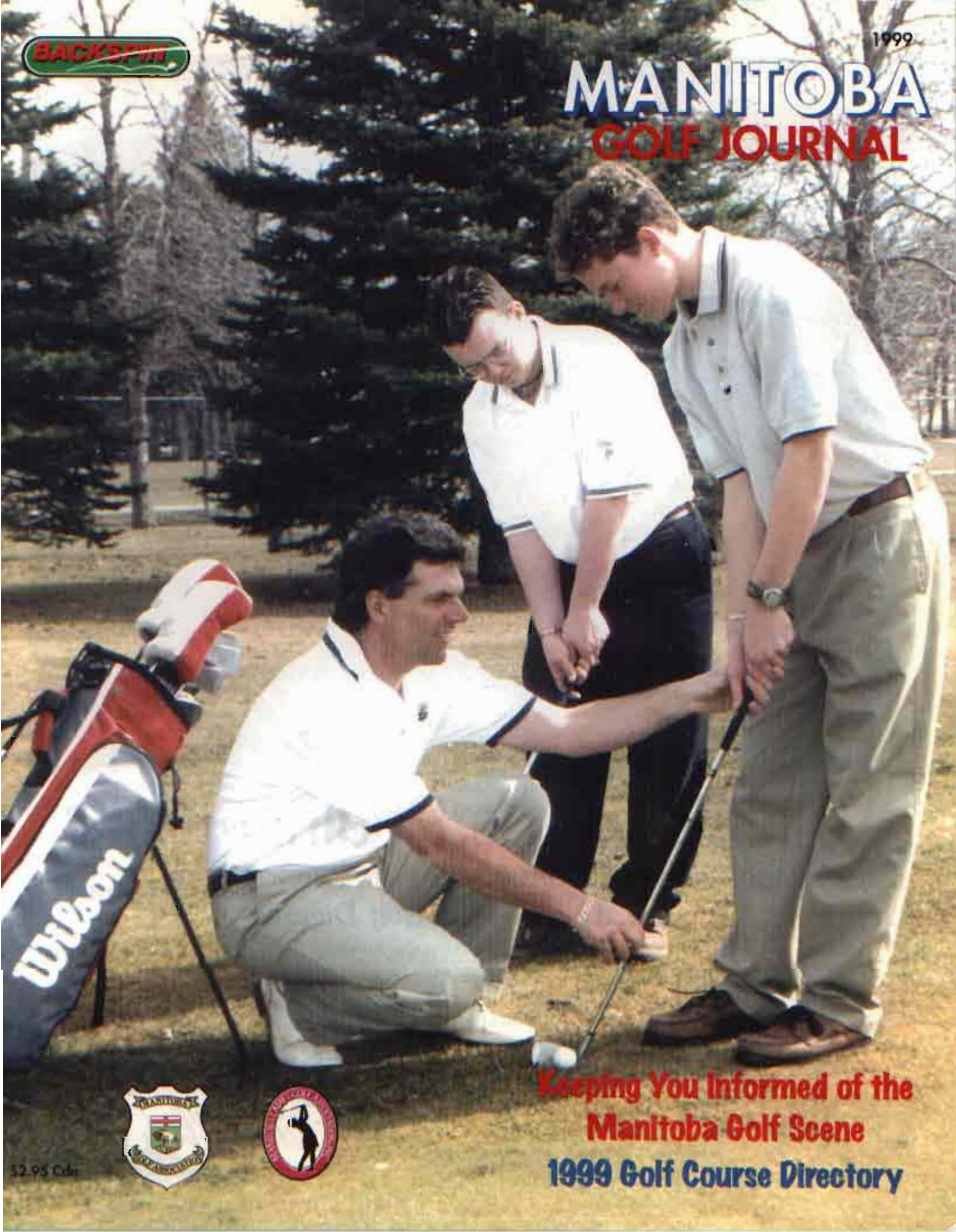

**O**n behalf of the Royal Canadian Golf Association, I would like to extend greetings and good wishes to the Manitoba Golf Association, member clubs and member players in the province.

Manitoba has always provided support and leadership for RCGA initiatives, and the province's enthusiasm for Future Links, presented by Mackenzie Financial Corporation, is proof positive that its support continues to grow. Last year 1,600 children participated in Future Links clinics in the province, and organizers at the RCGA expect that number to rise in 1999 - mainly due to Manitoba's inaugural Mobile Clinic program.

Utilizing a \$12,500 grant from Future Links, Manitoba will be operating one of Canada's seven Mobile Clinics. A Canadian PGA teaching professional, travelling through-

out Manitoba in a Ford Windstar van, will conduct these junior clinics at various courses, ranges, schools and recreation areas throughout the summer.

As well, clubs such as Clear Lake, Netley Creek and Halcrow Lake are supporting Future Links by operating Kids Club Connection depots, where second-hand clubs are collected, cut down to size for juniors, then re-distributed in the community.

One of my mandates as 1999 RCGA president is to continue to develop these kinds of initiatives, ensuring the future of the game has a solid foundation on which to grow. I would like to thank the Manitoba Golf Association, and all its affiliated members, and wish everyone an enjoyable and productive year of golf.

# MGA President's Message

The 1999 golf season will be one of change for the Manitoba Golf Association. Over the winter months volunteers and staff have been busy revamping a number of our programs.

Our website, "manitobagolf.mb.ca", has been reworked, and we will have entry forms, draws and hopefully daily results posted. The field for the Amateur will be increased to 171, which will give an additional 27 competitors an opportunity to challenge for our provincial championship.

Cell phones will not be permitted on competition courses for obvious reasons. A violation of this policy will result in disqualification. As well, all golfers are reminded that many courses have a mandatory spikeless policy which applies to all MGA events held on those courses.

For reasons unique to each team, all

team trials have been discontinued on a trial basis for 1999. The Tournament Committee and Board will assess the results in the fall of 1999 and decide whether to reintroduce the team trials for 2000. Your Executive would welcome any comments on this topic.

Ralph Bagley and his committee did an outstanding job of running the 1998 Jazz Manitoba Open on very short notice. With a full year to prepare for 1999, and expanding the event to 54 holes, I expect this year's Open to be a tremendous success.

In the fall of 1998, the MGA Board approved a \$2 per member increase in membership dues. The increase is the first in four years, in keeping with past practice of not increasing dues on an annual basis. In part, the increase will offset a \$10,000 decrease in Sport Manitoba funding for 1999/2000.

The MGA relies heavily on a large number of devoted volunteers and a capable staff. My thanks, on behalf of all golfers, is extended to the many volunteers and staff.

The MGA could not function effectively without the support and co-operation of member clubs, sponsors, and Sport Manitoba. We thank them for their contribution.

Best Wishes to all MGA members for a long and enjoyable 1999 season.

# Honor caps banner season for Hashimoto

He won three Manitoba golf championships in the 1998 season, so it came as no surprise when **Terry Hashimoto** of Breezy Bend was named Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year at the Manitoba Golf Association's annual meeting in November.

It was the year of the Mid-Amateur player in the voting for the annual Labatt award as Hashimoto was joined by mid-amateur provincial mates **Garth Collings** of Breezy Bend and **Bruce North** of Carman as the three finalists.

Hashimoto's outstanding season saw him capture the provincial Match Play, Amateur and Mid-Amateur championships and lead the Manitoba Amateur and Mid-Amateur teams. He was second low amateur at the Jazz M a n i t o b a Open.

Collings also had an outstanding year which included a victory at the Grey Owl tournament, low Manitoban at

the Canadian Club champions championship, runner-up to Hashimoto in the Mid-Amateur, third in the Amateur and fourth in Willingdon Cup trials, low amateur and low Manitoba golfer at the Canadian Tour MTS Classic, low amateur in the Jazz Manitoba Open and overall winner on the Manitoba Amateur Tour.

North was winner of the Manitoba Rural Amateur championship, fourth in the Mid-Amateur to earn a team berth and third low amateur at the Jazz Manitoba Open.

It was the third time Hashimoto earned Golfer of the Year award. He took the honors in 1976 and 1980. He also was a finalist on five other occasions, 1978-79-81-83-85. His total of eight marks the most times as a finalist.

It was the fifth appearance as a finalist for Collings, who also came close in 1988-94-95-96. North was a finalist for the second time, previously recognized in 1982.

**Rob McMillan** was a six-time winner of the Labatt award in 1990-92-93-94-95-96 and was also a finalist in 1990. **Todd Fanning** was a four-time winner in 1984-85-86-91 and was a finalist in 1992.

Double winners of the Golfer of the Year honors were **Bill Parker** in 1979 and 1982 and **Dale Goehring** in 1988 and 1997.

Honorable mention in the 1998 Golfer of the Year voting went to **Jim Scollan**, **Steven Bucko**, **Adam Speirs**, **Pat Fusee** and **Tammy Gibson**.

# Manitoba Pros on the Move

The listing of five new head professionals highlights a shuffling of positions among members of the CPGA of Manitoba heading into the 1999 season.

**Tom Betz**, who served as an associate professional at Rossmere in 1998, is returning to head pro ranks as the boss of the pro shop at the Clear Lake Golf Course, a position he occupied four years ago. He replaces **David Jones**, who has moved to Calgary.

Newcomers to the head pro ranks are: **Brock Balog**, who moves up from associate to become head pro at Tuxedo Golf Club; **Steve Wood**, who moves up from associate to head pro at South Interlake Golf and Country Club at Warren; **Scott Westman**, who moves from an associate post at Niakwa to become the first head professional at Killarney Lakeside Golf Club at Killarney; and **Bill North**, who

moves from an associate post at Southwood to become the first head professional at Oakview Golf and Country Club at Altona/Gretna.

Associate professionals switching clubs for this season include **Scott Chudley**, moving to Niakwa Country Club from Glendale; **Ross Lemon**, moving to Assiniboine Golf Club from Grand Pines; and **Jason Ludke**, moving to St. Boniface Golf Club from Pine Ridge. **Glen Mills** also goes to Assiniboine as an associate professional after serving as head pro at PGX Short Game last season.

Added to the list of assistant professionals for this year are **Dave McMillan**, moving in as assistant at South Interlake Golf and Country Club after working out of the PGX Short Game facility in 1998; and **Dean North**, who returns to an assistant post at St. Charles Country Club after playing last season on the Canadian Tour.

Moving into the teaching professional category this year are **Derek Ingram** at the Golf Max Virtual Golf Centre on Pembina Highway after spending last season on the Canadian Tour; and **Barry Gibson** and **Darren McMillan** at the new McGibbey's On the Range practice facility on the Perimeter Highway at Pipeline Road. Gibson worked at the PGX Short Game, while McMillan was head pro at Charleswood Golf Club last season.

**Pat Burns**, a former associate pro at St. Charles who was unattached last season, is listed as an affiliate professional this year.

New apprentice professionals joining the MPGA ranks this season include **David Bayrack** at Kingswood, **David Borowski** at St. Boniface, **Mark Hill** at St. Charles, **Corey Johnson** at Breezy Bend, **Sean Murphy** at Hecla Island and **Jason Sweeney** at Niakwa. •

## Coca Cola Player of the Year Gets format change

The Canadian Professional Golfers Association of Manitoba has announced a format change for the annual Coca-Cola Player of the Year rankings for the 1999 season.

In former years, the Manitoba pro golfers have to compete in compulsory rounds and then used their best five of up to 10 non-compulsory events to make up the total. Several pro-am events were included.

This year, the Coca-Cola points will be awarded only at all-pro events and the only compulsory rounds will be the three rounds of the Guertin MPGA championship, scheduled Aug. 4-6 at Glendale Country Club.

The Jazz Manitoba Open tournament, which was rein-

stated by the Manitoba Golf Association last year, has been added to the Coca-Cola qualifying events. The tournament is to be a 54-hole event Aug. 26-28 at John Blumberg Golf Club and the first two rounds will count in the Coca-Cola rankings.

The other events include the association's two TNT Package tournaments, set for May 14 at Carman and June 4 at Blumberg; the Falcon Open tournament, Sept. 6 at Falcon Beach; and the 36-hole Wilson Fall Classic, Sept. 13-14 at Rossmere.

The Manitoba professionals will count their best eight of the 10 tournament rounds, with the three rounds of the MPGA championship compulsory. •

# Spotlight on Junior Development

The main focus may be on junior players, but **Garth Goodbrandson** is fully behind the development of golf in Manitoba at all levels.

Into his second year as the Manitoba Golf Association's Athletic

Development Co-ordinator, Goodbrandson can look back with pride at the successes of the past year and forward to expanding the programs this season.

"We had approximately 75 young players involved in our junior camp programs last year and we want to expand that," Goodbrandson said. "We're hoping to get up to 125 this year."

The junior program included three regional camps in 1998 and a fourth is to be added in 1999 to take in the Northwest Ontario region.

Goodbrandson is particularly hopeful of starting a camp for golfers age 14 and under. "I want to get at the ages 10 to 14 and inform them of the benefits of golf and get them started earlier in our programs," he said.

In addition to the many golf camps and clinics staged in the summer months, Goodbrandson maintained an active winter program which featured special practice privileges and tutoring at The Dome for some of the elite junior golfers.

Thirteen players are involved in the Advance A portion of Goodbrandson's program. These players take part in the Mundie Putter League matches and are involved in special camps.

The Advance B group is made up of another 16-18 players who have shown some promise in competitions and might benefit from extra attention.

Goodbrandson had plans in May for a special two-day camp for 14 and under golfers as well as a Rural Camp for golfers living outside Winnipeg. Four regional camps are slated for players with handicaps of 10-20 in June and July in western, eastern and central Manitoba and Northwest Ontario. The aim is to have another camp for northern Manitoba youngsters in the future.

Meanwhile, the regular program of rural golf clinics will be continued throughout the province. These clinics feature an introduction to golf and instruction sessions for juniors and adults, male and female. There

were 46 clinics at 25 sites last year and Goodbrandson hopes to maintain or enlarge that program.

Another special camp for juvenile golfers 16 and under is to be held in late June or early July at Quarry Oaks under the Royal Canadian Golf Association's Future Links program. This will take in six leading juveniles from Manitoba and six from Saskatchewan.

Goodbrandson speaks enthusiastically when he explains the various aspects of his position and hopes to pass on an exciting attitude toward the game of golf.

"I really enjoy the opportunity to work with juniors, especially in the rural areas where they haven't had a chance to work with golf professionals," he said. "It's great to see the interest grow and it shows in the number of kids who are starting to play in tournaments. A lot of them thought they weren't good enough, so we like to encourage them and build their confidence."

As an example he cited the record entry of 216 players in the 1998 Manitoba junior championship, of which half came from rural areas.

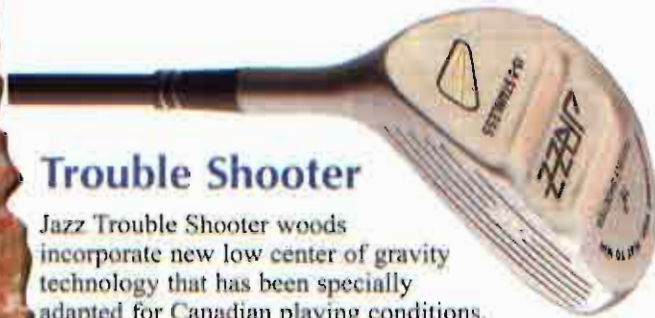

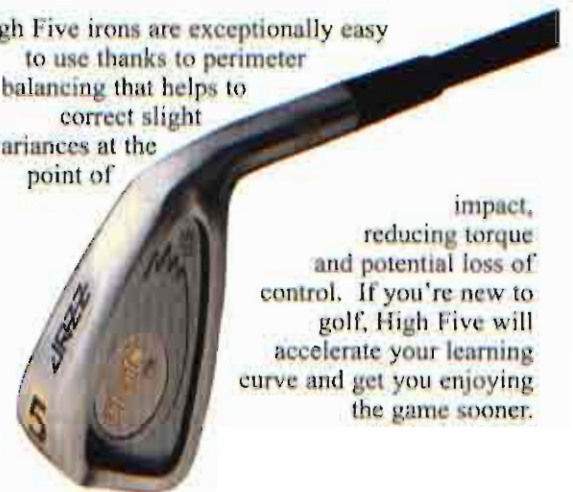

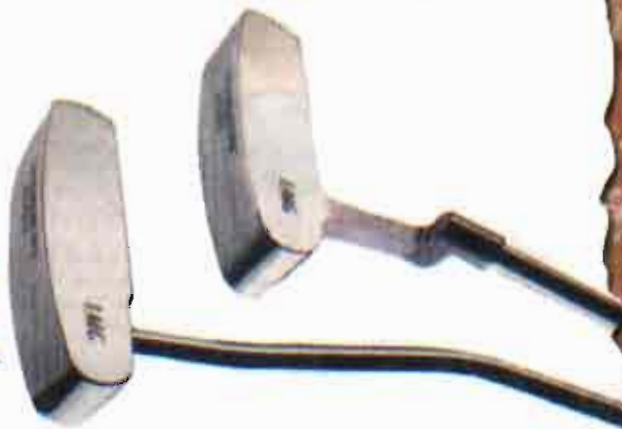

## No team trials in 99

The Manitoba Golf Association has announced all team trials have been discontinued on a trial basis for the 1999 season. The Tournament Committee will reassess the policy in the fall.

This year's Manitoba Willingdon Cup team will be determined at the completion of the 72-hole Manitoba Amateur championship, to be played July 19-22 at Niakwa and Steinbach. In previous years, the 16 top players from the Amateur played an additional 36 holes to complete the Willingdon Cup team trials over a six-round route.

"We found that in most years, at least three of the team berths were locked up by the completion of the Amateur and two extra rounds were being played for one spot," executive director Dave Morison explained. "We feel the four rounds of the Amateur will provide a sufficient test and this way we also assure that the Amateur Champion will be part of the Willingdon Cup team."

The provincial junior team had also used an extra two-round team trial after the 72-hole Manitoba Junior championship to set the team line-up. This year, the top four players from the championship will represent the province at the national championships.

In place of the team trials, the junior team members this year will attend a two-day compulsory team orientation camp at Tuxedo on the weekend following the junior championship, which is to be played July 13-16 at Transcona and Rat River, under sponsorship of AT&T Canada.

The provincial senior team this year will be determined by the 54-hole Manitoba Senior championship, doing away with the extra team round which had been played the following day. The Senior Championship will be played Aug. 3-5 at South Interlake and Breezy Bend.

The provincial Mid-Amateur team will be determined in the 54-hole Manitoba Mid-Amateur championship June 28-30 at Pinawa. There had been no extra team trial in that category.

## JAZZ MANITOBA OPEN

## '99 tournament to be bigger, better

**B**uoyed by the success of a hurriedly organized 36-hole competition in 1998, plans are under way to make the second Jazz Manitoba Open golf championship bigger and better this year.

The 1999 Jazz Manitoba Open will be expanded to a 54-hole championship with a field of 144 players in an event that will feature more prize money for the professionals and more merchandise prizes for the amateurs.

The event will return this season to the John Blumberg Golf Course on a Thursday-Saturday schedule, Aug. 26-28. It will again feature an opportunity for Manitoba's top professional and amateur golfers to compete.

Plans are also being developed to include a special women's invitational section with up to 15 places available for local female professional and leading amateurs to compete.

The Jazz Manitoba Open golf committee was conducting a drive for sponsors in the spring and an announcement will be made early in the season on the final figures.

Jazz Golf will continue as the title sponsor, increasing its contribution to \$7,500 from the \$5,000 provided for the initial event in 1998. A number of other Gold, Silver and Bronze sponsors will be announced later.

The Jazz Manitoba Open in 1998, under the auspices of the Manitoba Golf Association, pro-

vided the opportunity to keep alive the longest-running provincial open golf championship in the country. It was the 68th annual Manitoba Open without missing a beat.

The operating committee is under the chairmanship of **Ralph Bagley**, editorial consultant of Backspin and a former Free Press golf writer. **John Multan**, representing the amateur competitive golfers, is vice-chairman, with **Rick Thain** of the City of Winnipeg golf courses as treasurer and **Cindy Nielsen** of the Manitoba Golf Journal/Backspin as secretary.

The other committee members include **Rob MacDonald**, **Don Forsyth** and **Bob Gill** of the MGA; **Tom Kinsman**, **Mike Gottfred**, **Dale Esopenko** and **Ben Smirnov** from the CPGA of Manitoba; **Terry Hashimoto** and **Jeff Gidney** of Jazz Golf and **Brad Gray** of Quicksilver as sponsor representatives; and **Bob Picken**, media representative.

The 36-hole Jazz Manitoba Open in 1998 was organized in less than a month and offered more than \$10,000 in pro money and \$2,200 in amateur prizes. Dave McMillan captured the championship and \$3,000 with four-under-par 138 total, while the low amateur honors went to Garth Collings with 141.

The field for the 1999 version of the championship will include up to 120 local exempt players (60 pros and 60 amateurs), up to 10 sponsor-

exempt players and a minimum of 14 from a qualifying round to be played on Aug. 23. There will be a cut to the low 60 and ties for the final round.

The committee announced the first exemptions for the 1999 Jazz Manitoba Open would go the 11 leading professionals and nine leading amateurs from the 1998 event. Further exemptions will be announced later under guidelines established by the pro and amateur representatives.

The first 11 pro exemptions go to **Dave McMillan**, **Mac McLeod**, **Rob McMillan**, **Dean North**, **Glen Mills**, **Barry Gibson**, **Derek Ingram**, **John Bowen**, **Rob Doucette**, **Dave Michaleski** and **Dwight Reinhart**. The first nine amateur exemptions go to **Garth Collings**, **Terry Hashimoto**, **Bruce North**, **Ben Bandura**, **Jared Ladobruk**, **Jeff Machnicki**, **Jason Brennan**, **Russel Slobodian** and **Kevin Kotyk**.

The 1999 Jazz Manitoba Open (69th annual Manitoba Open) is under the auspices of the Manitoba Golf Association and also has the blessings of the Canadian Professional Golfers Association of Manitoba, which will include the first two rounds of the event in its Coca-Cola Player of the Year rankings.

The Open committee has stressed there is no intention to compete with the Canadian Tour's MTS Classic played in July and the major purpose remains to provide an event that will feature Manitoba pros and amateurs. ●

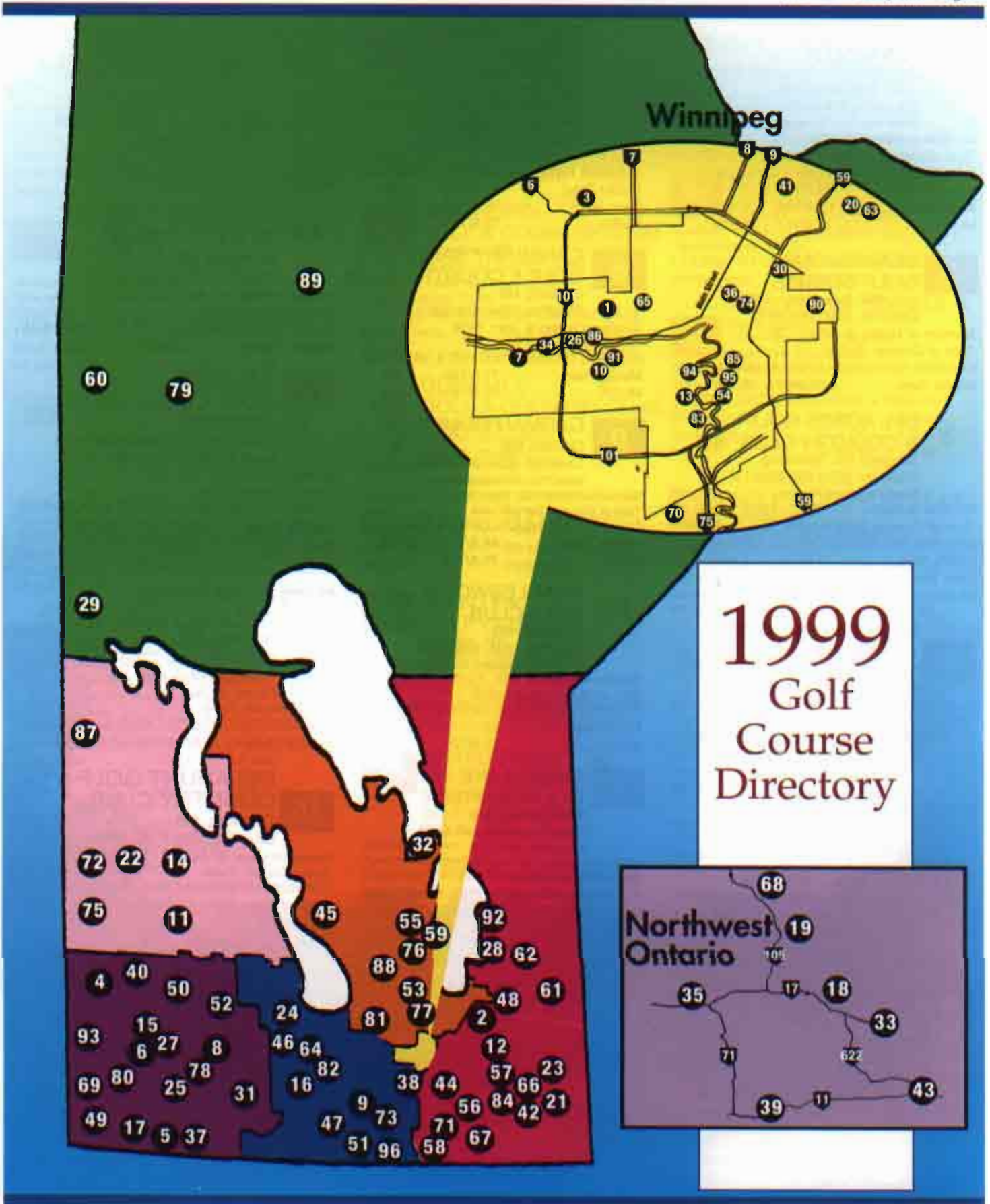

## EXECUTIVE COURSE TO OPEN IN 2000

Manitoba golfers will have a new golf course to play in the 2000 season when Tracy Kibsey and Wendy Mandryk open an 18-hole layout adjacent to their Southside Golf Center.

It will be called The Executive Course and will feature a total yardage of about 4,800 yards from the back tees. Par will be 63 for men from forward or back tees, while women's par will be 63 from the front and 66 from the back tees.

The men's layout features only one par-five hole, the 555-yard 17th, along with seven par-four holes and 10 par-threes. The forward tees include three par-five holes for women. Shortest hole on the course will be 110 yards from the back tee.

Contouring for the new layout was completed last summer and seeding of the course is to be done this spring. The opening is planned for early in the 2000 season.

The new course and Southside Golf Centre are located south of the Red River Floodway and one mile east of Highway 59 on Carriere Road. ●

# Tour event returns to Elmhurst

Elmhurst Golf and Country Club will again be the site for the Canadian Tour stop in Manitoba this season as the second MTS Classic is scheduled July 8-11.

Tournament Director **Mitch Zalnasky** said the \$125,000 event, with the Winnipeg Free Press as the organizing and marketing agent, is again anticipating an excellent field of the Canadian Tour players for the 72-hole test.

The MTS Classic week will actually start July 5 with a qualifying round to be played at Breezy Bend Country Club.

At Elmhurst, there will be practice rounds on the Monday and Tuesday, two pro-am tournaments (morning and afternoon) on the Wednesday, and then the big show Thursday to Sunday.

"The pro-am format we introduced last year was very popular," Zalnasky



reported. "I'm sure nobody was on the course for more than four and half hours and everyone seemed to enjoy the split event."

While the field won't be known until the 1999 Canadian Tour gets under way in British Columbia in May (the final qualifying for the Tour was set for May 4-7 at Kamloops), Zalnasky expects most of the Tour players to be here and anticipates **Perry Parker** will come to defend the title he won with a seven-under-par total of 277.

Amateur **Garth Collings** of Breezy Bend was the low Manitoba player and the low amateur in the inaugural MTS Classic, which replaced the Manitoba Open as a Canadian Tour stop.

This will be the final year of a three-year deal for the event to be played at Elmhurst (the Xerox Manitoba Open in 1997 and the MTS Classic last year). Zalnasky said there had been some

preliminary talks with other sites, but he won't concentrate on the future location until this year's event is completely organized. •

# President looks to future

**A**nne Leibl formed a significant conclusion in her first year as the major domo of women's golf in Manitoba.

"It's a changing golf scene out there, and we have to be flexible and learn to innovate as we head toward the next century," said the MLGA president, as she moved into a second term.

In that respect, Leibl admits to having some serious concerns about the trend of local golf interest, and the future role of the MLGA. She accepts the fact that change can be healthy, but hopes that the long-standing spirit of the game will not be abandoned.

"More and more the local emphasis is on charity and corporate events with a scramble format, with big prizes and Calcutta's," she pointed out. "Is that the kind of golf atmosphere we should be encouraging?"

Leibl and the MLGA directors recognize the popularity of these one and two-day promotions, and the benefits they may produce for worthy causes. But they also have

an obvious negative effect on golf course availability, and lead to a reduction in interest for many traditional tournaments.

"We dropped the Colleen Hutchison Memorial tournament due to lack of entries last year, and it will remain suspended for this season," she revealed. "Another disappointment was our failure to return the City and District tourney to 54 holes. It will stay as a 36-hole event because we couldn't obtain a city course to go with Kingswood and Carman."

Leibl said the Hutchison trophy will not be retired, and the tourney could be resurrected in the future. But putting it on the shelf is consistent with the apparent indifference now toward higher handicap competition.

In spite of that, the MLGA will continue to stage the Manitoba Crocus Team Tournament, a net best ball event for golfers with a handicap index from 18.4 to 40.1. It will be held June 14 at St. Charles Country Club, and is open to teams of four players or individuals.

The MLGA president is grateful for the response of rural clubs to the request for use of courses. "Winkler will be super for our provincial amateur and seniors, Rat River will be linked with Transcona for the juniors, the rural championship goes to Dauphin, and we'll be in Portage for the provincial NCTC," she stated.


The problem of securing golf courses is not restricted to the women's association. The MGA is encountering the same difficulty with Winnipeg clubs, and also is resorting to the use of rural sites - Oakview (Altona), Pinawa, Steinbach, South Interlake, Pelican Beach, and even Kenora (for the Winnipeg Inter - club) to fill its fixture card.

Leibl recalls the associations used to work on a three-year rotation plan to allocate city clubs to tournaments, but that went by the boards. "It made a lot of sense to approach it that way," she believes. "The clubs shared the obligation to provide the venues for our events. I hope we can sit down with the MGA, the CPGA of Manitoba, and club reps to develop something like it again."

# National event opens season

The concluding event of the 1998 national women's season will be the curtain raiser on the '99 local golf calendar.

Postponed due to the airline pilots' strike last September, the 1998 National Club Teams championship (NCTC) has been re-scheduled for May 16-17 at Rossmere Golf and Country Club.

Three two-member teams will represent Manitoba, from provincial champion Oakview, Pine Falls, and John Blumberg.

The major change on the MLGA schedule for '99 is the separation of the Manitoba Junior Women's Championship from the Amateur and Seniors. The Junior will continue to be a 54-hole competition, but it now will be linked to the MGA's Junior Men's Championship, and held July 13-15 at Transcona, Rat River, and back to Transcona for the final round.

"We think this is a progressive move," said MLGA president Anne Leibl. "Conducting the two junior events together has been a success in New Brunswick. We can accept up

to 50 female entries, more than double our former limitation. This could become a permanent arrangement."

It also means more golfers can be accommodated in the Amateur-Senior bracket at Winkler July 12-14 for the 54-hole provincials. They now will be open to the 56 amateurs and 40 seniors entering with the lowest handicap index.

Winkler was expanded to 18 holes five years ago, and now is one of the southern Manitoba's most challenging layouts. The MLGA held its "B" team Inter-club at the course last season.

Tammy Gibson won the Amateur crown in '98, Jo-Ann Lindsay captured the Seniors for the sixth time in seven years, and 14-year-old Kathleen Zeweniuk was the youngest Junior champion in 43 years.

The provincials will be preceded by the Manitoba Crocus Team Tournament June 14 at St. Charles Country Club, while Pat Fusee will defend her City and District title over 36 holes June 28-29 at Kingswood and Carman.

The Rural Championship was enlarged to include Senior, Junior, and Amateur divisions last year. Heather McMunn won the Junior and was the overall leader in a field of 70 golfers, while Sherri Moorhouse paced the Amateur bracket and Carol Wiebe was the top Senior. This season the 18-hole tourney will be held July 30 at Dauphin.

Four events are scheduled for the latter part of the season. The Interclub A team competition goes Aug. 3 at Pine Ridge, and B team play is slated for August 23 at South Interlake.

The provincial NCTC will be held August 11 at Portage, and the Bronze tournament provincial final August 19 at The Wildewood Club. The seasonal wrap-up event is the Foursome, September 2 at Glendale Golf and Country Club.

## Jo-Ann Lindsay moves up on teams ladder



**W**hen Jo-Ann Lindsay captured her sixth Manitoba senior women's golf championship last season, it also marked the third time she lined up on the MLGA's provincial senior women's team.

That moved her into a tie for eighth place among female golfers who have played on provincial

teams over the years, with a total of 12. Lindsay is the only golfer to play on teams at all three levels - junior, amateur and senior.

As **Jo-Ann Percy**, she played on three junior teams in 1955-56-57. As **Jo-Ann Lindsay**, she was on six amateur teams (1974, 1977, 1980, 1981, 1983 and 1995), then on the senior teams in 1996-97-98.

Her total of 12 moved her into a tie with **Marg**

**Homenuik**, who played on one junior and 11 amateur teams.

Hall-of-Famer **Ann Tachan** leads the teams parade with 25 appearances, 11 amateur and 14 senior.

**Lynda Palahniuk** and **Merlene Netterfield** are next with 18 each. Palahniuk was on two junior and 16 amateur teams, while Netterfield played on nine amateur and nine senior squads.

**Marg Edey**, another Hall-of-Famer, played on 12 amateur and three senior teams for a total of 15, followed by **June Bagley** with 14 (five amateur, nine senior). Next in line with 13 are **Marg Ford** (four amateur and nine senior) and **Aileen Robertson** (four junior and nine amateur).

### No Cellular Phones

Both the Manitoba Golf Association and the Manitoba Ladies Golf Association have decreed that competitors will not be permitted to carry cellular telephones on competition golf courses.

The penalty for violation of this rule will be disqualification from the event, whether the cellular phone is in use or not. Any player found with a cell phone in his equipment will be disqualified.

"With the team qualifications and various exemptions on the line, there's a lot at stake in our tournaments," executive director Dave Morison pointed out. "We don't want to take any chance of players being interrupted by cell phones."

Meanwhile, Leibl is forging ahead on two new fronts, marketing and communication. "We're teaming up with the MGA to hire a marketing firm (DCB Productions) to help promote our image," she said. "The intention is to secure new sponsorships, and to convince our general membership that a \$20 affiliation fee (of which \$11 goes to the CLGA) is a reasonable sum to help fund the cost of golf operations in the country."

"I also wanted our executive to get closer to the people that represent us in the districts," she suggested. "I thought the best way to do that was to visit their turf, and we organized 13 small meetings in the month of April throughout the province and into northwestern Ontario."

Leibl, vice-president **Carol Doerksen**, secretary-treasurer **Barbara Fenton**, and executive director **Barb Leisle**, hit the road in the MGA van and conducted 10 meetings in rural locations (along with three in Winnipeg), discussing administrative procedures, particular problems in various locations, and ways and means of rectifying inefficiencies.

"This replaced our spring semi-annual meeting, which didn't seem to provide the input we'd like to get from the districts," said Leibl. "If there's a way to streamline the MLGA operation in any way, we want to know about it."

## Cathy Burton named National Junior Coach

The Canadian Ladies Golf Association has announced the appointment of **Cathy Burton**, associate professional at St. Charles Country Club, as national junior coach for 1999.

Burton takes over from **Cathy Sherk**, who was national junior coach for the past two seasons.

She will conduct a national junior women's camp for the top eight junior players in the country May 20-24 at St. Charles Country Club, and will also attend two regional camps - early June in Prince Edward Island and late June in Calgary.

Burton will attend the national junior women's championship in August at Stony Plain, AB., and will also work in consultation with provincial organizations.

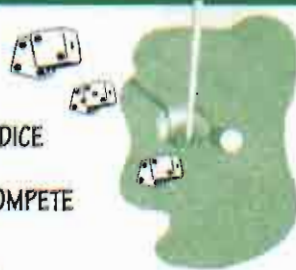

## Chip Shots

### Seven in Canadian Junior

Entry in the Canadian Junior Men's Championship will no longer be based on scores from the first two rounds of the provincial junior championship and there will be no Monday qualifying round.

The RCGA has allocated a number of entries to each province based on the number making the cut in the last three years.

It has also ruled that juvenile age players must be allocated 25 per cent of each province's quota.

Manitoba's quota for this year is seven players and at least two must be of juvenile age. The four low scores will from the provincial team and the next three positions will go to the next three players, providing two juveniles are included.

### Tournament Changes

The MGA Tournament Committee has announced changes in two of the provincial championship events this season.

The Manitoba Amateur Championship will feature an increased field of 171 players, up from the 144 limit of previous years.

Qualifying tournaments for golfers not exempt from the previous season will be played July 5 at Killarney and La Verendrye to make up the field.

The provincial Mid-Amateur tournament will feature a cut to the low 60 and ties after two rounds if the entry is greater than 100 golfers this year. There were 112 players in the event in 1998.

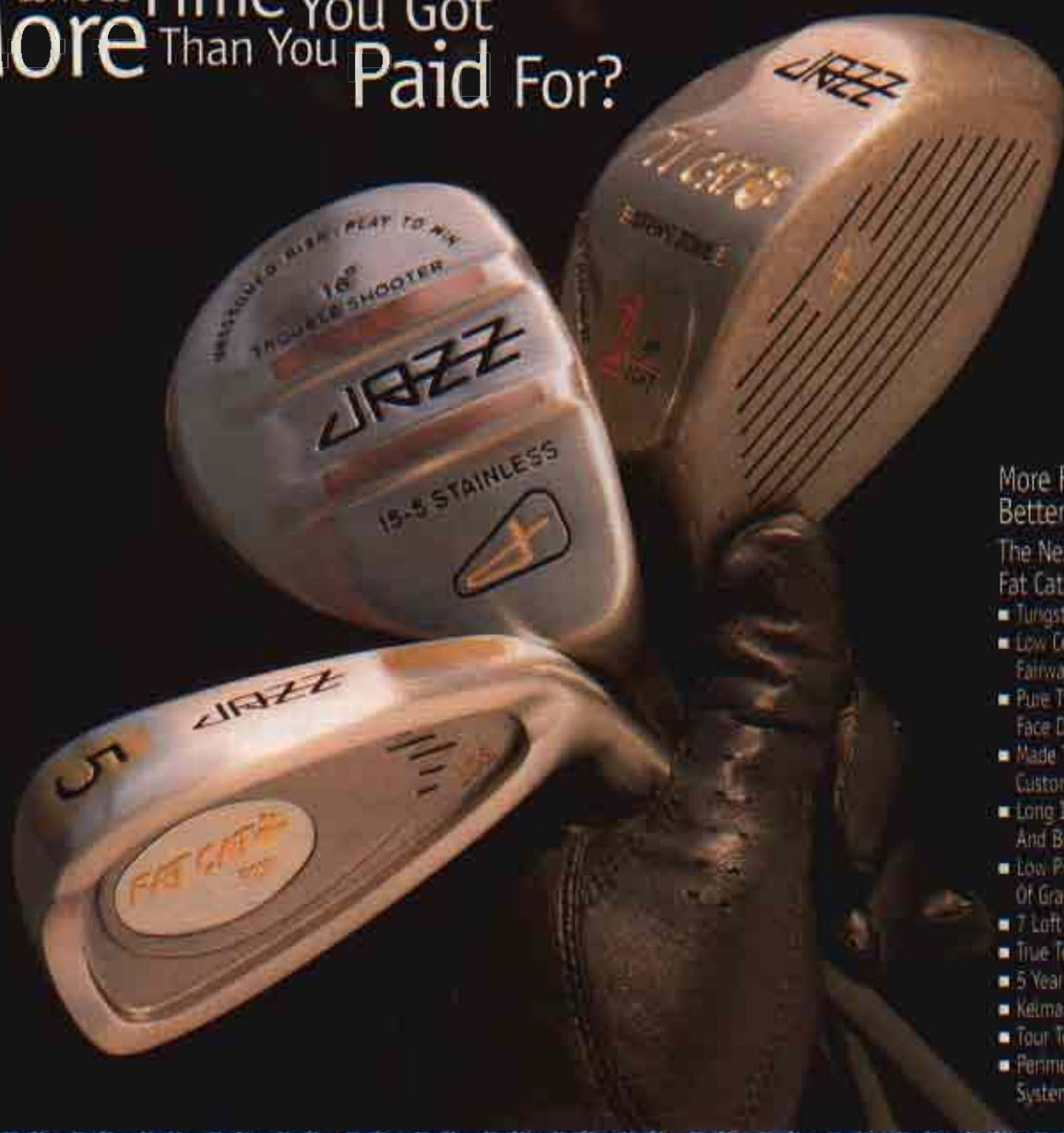
